Dear Readers,

High temperatures in different parts of the world are setting new weather records. Alaska broke its own heat record on 4th of July with a temperature of 32 degrees Celsius; the usually cool state had not witnessed such high temperatures since 1989. Kuwait and Saudi Arabia recorded the hottest temperature on Earth at 52.2 degrees Celsius and 55 degrees Celsius, respectively. Bahrain also witnessed a temperature of 46.6 degrees Celsius, the highest it has had since Renewal. Pakistan and India also reported that the heat wave, which has been ongoing since mid-May, has been the longest and hottest ever witnessed. Record high heat waves also struck Europe, with temperatures at 45 degrees Celsius. Spain, France and Germany were the most affected countries. As a country with a desert environment and a naturally hot climate, we feel the effects of the rising temperatures the most. The country

continued to experience higher levels of humidity than usual. The last few years we have recorded unprecedented rates in the thermostats in the Arab world and this simply means that we must act NOW!

On the EEG front, July has been quite a pleasant and productive month. We would like to share with all of you the accomplishments and significant events of the group during the month. On the waste management front, EEG successfully concluded its popular paper recycling project “**Recycle.Reforest.Repeat**”, which was rolled out on the 19th of June till the 19th of July. The project witnessed a growth of 32% in collections compared to 2018 and effectively contributed to the global celebrations of the World Day to Combat Desertification and Drought ([read more on page 3](#)). EEG’s Neighbourhood Recycling Project is currently running full speed and is receiving registrations and deposits, welcoming the student community in the UAE to actively engage in recycling practices during the summer months ([read more on page 3](#)). I am delighted to share that the fruitful month of July has granted 249 saplings of indigenous trees to the champions of the above mentioned projects, to be planted under their names, in EEG’s “**For Our Emirates We Plant**” tree planting ceremony on 19.12.19, contributing to EEG’s set target of planting 1,500 trees in 2019. I am also proud to say that we have achieved 57.5% of this goal as of the end of the month of July.

The month of July further witnessed the active planning for the programmes in store for the second half of the year. EEG is preparing to open registration for its Students’ Workshops and is already accepting applications from teams across the MENA region for the Inter College Environmental Public Speaking Competition. We will also hold our 4th panel discussion for the year on the 26th of August on the topic of “**Artificial Intelligence and Sustainability**”. I extend the invitation to all our readers and members to register for all our upcoming events.

I urge each and every one of you to actively participate and contribute towards the betterment of the environment and to reflect on the change that has been achieved on the individual and corporate level. Through our small and bigger steps, we aim to bring about a positive environmental change nationally and globally.

“Recycle. Reforest. Repeat” wraps up for 2019 with a collection of 174,238 Kg of Paper

As an accredited organisation to the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD), EEG's annual popular paper recycling project “Recycle. Reforest. Repeat” made return on the 19th of June to commemorate the World Day to Combat Desertification and Drought which was celebrated globally on the 17th of June. For the third consecutive year, EEG rolled out the project to engage the different sectors of the society in recycling practices and encouraged them to take action towards combating desertification. The project that took place on the 19th of June until the 19th of July, witnessed an active participation of 147 individuals and families, 42 academic institutions and 57 government and private sector entities from all of the seven Emirates.

The project witnessed an increase in collections from the previous years, receiving 17,639 Kg of Paper in 2016, 48,526 kg of paper in 2017 and 127,763 kg of paper in 2018. The growth of the programme by 32% demonstrated the effectiveness of EEG's environmental awareness campaign and the growing adoption of responsible and sustainable practices by different sectors of the community. In the one-month period, the participants effectively backed the global contributions to the Sustainable Development Goal 15, which calls to protect, restore and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, sustainably manage forests, combat desertification, and halt and reverse land degradation. The recycling of the collected paper will result in the mitigation of 674 metric tons of carbon dioxide emissions and saved 3,911MWh of energy, 550m³ of landfill space and 2,962 trees from being felled. EEG will award the highest collectors of this project on the 19th of September during a meaningful closing ceremony. The champions of the project will be awarded with certificates of participation and with saplings of an indigenous tree to be planted under their names as a part of EEG's “For Our Emirates We Plant” tree planting ceremony on 19.12.19. A total of 227 trees will be planted as the result of this project, contributing to EEG's set target of planting 1,500 trees in 2019. EEG salutes its environmental champions and calls upon the society at large to make such recycling practices a regular and consistent feature all year round, advocating the importance of inclusive cooperation to restore and rehabilitate degraded land and contribute towards achieving the overall Sustainable Development Goals.



EEG welcomes registrations for the Neighbourhood Recycling Project

The “Neighbourhood Recycling Project” has its 9th edition ongoing as 117 EEG student members registered till end of July. The annual campaign is set out to ensure that our student members have a recycling platform to engage in during their summer vacations. It invites them to participate from the 1st of June to the 30th of September to create flyers and distribute them in their chosen time frame of two weeks to meet the given targets of the listed recyclable materials. Once the minimum targets are met, the well-deserved students will take part in planting a tree under their name with EEG, at EEG's tree planting ceremony “For Our Emirates, We Plant”, set to take place on the 19.12.19. The students have since submitted 8,530Kg of Paper, 91 Kg of Aluminum Cans, and 75 pieces of toners. We highly encourage our student members to be the initiators of change in their neighbourhoods and come on board this strong platform to show their commitment and proactively participate in hands on actions to protect the environment.

His future goals are to major in Environmental Science, and to design innovative solutions for environmental programmes.



Young Inventor creates RFID Tissue Dispenser

Sidhart Vattezhat, a 9th grade student of Leaders Private School and a student member of EEG, has taken the initiative for a sustainable change for his school by creating a radio - frequency tissue dispenser which limits the usage of the dispenser to only five times per day by students and staff. "I was talking to my school coordinator about issues that are present in our school, and the misusage of tissues is something I underlined. I decided to take action against this issue and started doing some deep research on how I will act against it". The young inventor took two months to put together a plan and learn coding from YouTube videos before putting it into action. Sidhart aims to have other schools and organisations pick up the invention as it has provided positive results in his own school. He is also conducting researches to tackle other issues around the UAE.

An Incredible amount of 1,330Kg of waste collected by EEG Student Member for “Reforest. Recycle. Repeat”

Nehan Naseem Ali, an EEG student member since 2017, and a 5th grader at the Indian High School Dubai has collected a staggering amount of 1,330KG of Paper. Nehan reveals that even though he ensures that he collects every month, during this time of the year when EEG campaign “Reforest. Recycle. Repeat” takes place he takes special preparation for it.

The young collector told the EEG team that social media and campaigning in his local community were big helpers in his collection and he encourages other participants of the project to give it a try. “This campaign is special to me because it helps me push my own limits; I was so tense about reaching the target but once I started, I broke goals of my own” said Nehan.

Nehan found his journey in recycling since his days in kindergarten and has been featured in magazines for the topic of environmental protection. He also served as Head Boy and a student council member as the Islamic Ambassador. He will be planting 3 trees under his name at the EEG ceremony, “For Our Emirates, We Plant” on 19.12.19.



Students take the initiative to make use of electronic waste for others

Students at GEMS Modern Academy an academic member of EEG in Dubai have taken the initiative of refurbishing old and not in use electronics in the UAE, by forming a programme named “Revive”. The programme was started as an idea to create awareness for the large amounts of electronic waste that is being generated in the UAE. The students wanted to help their schools’ support staff and therefore embarked on refurbishing 25 laptops and watches. Many of the support staff have children in schools and universities, who stated that this activity will be extremely helpful for the educational growth of their children.

Since the first edition of “Revive” in 2017, students have managed to refurbish 95 laptops, 225 mobile phones as well as tablets and watches, under the supervision of the school’s assistant engineer. They will continue to do so and hope more people will join the initiative.

Sheikha Shamma’s words marked by the British Centre for Excellence

On the 20th of July, the UAE’s late founding father, Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan’s great granddaughter, Sheikha Shamma bint Sultan bin Khalifa Al Nahyan, has received appreciation by permanently marking her words as a quotation on the wall of the British Centre for Excellence at the University of Cambridge in the United Kingdom. “It is our collective duty to lead responsibly to create a better world for future generations”. Her quote is displayed both in English and Arabic, and sits next to one from Michelle Obama, former First Lady of the United States.

Sheikha Shamma recently completed her master’s degree in Sustainability Leadership, and also became the first Arab woman to be recognised at the Moller Institute at Churchill College for her work in sustainability.

LOCAL NEWS

‘World’s largest solar panel located in UAE’

“Noor Abu Dhabi” the ‘world’s largest solar project’ - with a capacity of 1,177MW has started commercial operation, announced by Emirates Water and Electricity Company in Abu Dhabi. The AED 3.2 billion solar plants is a joint venture between the Abu Dhabi Government and a consortium of Japan’s Marubeni Corp and China’s Jinko Holding. The project will highly benefit the city of Abu Dhabi, by preserving the Emirate’s natural gas resources and reducing the CO₂ emissions by 1 million metric tons annually.

The plant will greatly contribute to making Abu Dhabi’s energy more efficient and sustainable, while holding a capacity large enough to cover the demand of 90,000 people.



‘Incredible increase for innovation towards sustainability’

The Zayed Sustainability Prize, a global award which gives recognition and rewards those who excel in innovating and inspiring sustainability, has this year received a total of 2,373 applicants. Submissions are now closed and the 12th ceremony which happens annually is set to take place in Abu Dhabi in January 2020.

The evolution of the prize saw the edition of the following categories last year of - Food, Water, and Health alongside the existing category of Energy, to align the Prize more closely to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGS). The Prize saw a significant increase in the number of applicants, in regards to the expansion of categories, by 13%. The top countries for submissions were Nigeria, UAE, USA, Colombia, and India. Locally, the UAE increased by 86% in submissions and 74% from emerging markets.

H.E. Dr. Sultan Ahmed Al Jaber, UAE Minister of State and Director General of the Prize, said: “Inspired by the legacy of the UAE’s founding father, the late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, the Prize continues to demonstrate the UAE’s commitment to promoting sustainability and humanitarianism” (Zayed Sustainability Prize’s Website)



Al Dhafra Project

Emirates Water and Electricity Company (EUWC), the sole provider of water and electricity in Abu Dhabi, is inviting bidders to invest for the 2,000MW solar photovoltaic power project located in Al Dhafra. The bidders will hold 40% equity with the remaining stake held by local entities. The project site will cover 20 square kilometers and once completed in 2022, it will be double the capacity of the current largest operational solar PV plant - Noor Abu Dhabi. It aligns with the UAE Energy Strategy 2050, which aims to increase clean energy as part of the country's overall energy mix. Meanwhile, the Abu Dhabi Department of Energy (DoE) announced the launch on the 29th of June, of the Recycled Water Policy, which is now applicable to all sectors to maximise the use of recycled water. The Policy is set to preserve Abu Dhabi's water resources (drinking and underground) for the future needs of generations to come. The Recycled Water Strategy perfectly aligns with the objectives of the UAE water Security Strategy 2036.



Floating Solar Panels to be installed in Dubai

As part of Dubai Municipality and Dubai Electricity and Water Authority (DEWA)'s joint efforts to transition into renewable energy to align with the Dubai Clean Energy Strategy 2050, the studies of the installation of a floating photovoltaic solar panel system on the deep tunnel rainwater drainage lakes are being looked to be implemented by the Municipality, which is 50% already completed. The project will aim to establish a solar lake and contribute to the production of clean energy. The station will float on artificial lakes close to Al Maktoum International Airport, so that the lakes can receive rainwater and surface water from neighbouring areas to be stored and discharged into the deep tunnel. The establishment of the system will be a sustainable solution to produce electricity in clean ways and the presence of the station on the water will help reduce the heat surrounding the solar panels and raise their efficiency.

DEWA advises using power wisely from 12pm to 6pm

The Dubai Electricity and Water Authority (DEWA) recently announced a new campaign called, "Let's Make This Summer Green". The campaign is to advise residents on being cautious with the consumption of energy between 12pm to 6pm, which are peak load hours. DEWA reported that the peak demand spiked up during the day as many residents took that period of the day to do energy - intensive chores, resulting in more carbon emissions production than the average amount. It is advised by DEWA to do such chores before and after peak load hours, as this will lead them to save more energy and move forward to a sustainable future.

REGIONAL NEWS

'Water Cutting Strategy – KSA'

The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia is the third highest country with water consumption per capita, after USA and Canada. It is currently facing water stress as the ground water supply is low. It is in one of the world's driest countries, water scarcity is a major concern to the high population of 34.1 million people. The Qatrak Programme was announced during the Saudi Water Forum 2019 in Riyadh and was approved by the Minister of Environment, Water and Agriculture, the programme strategically aims to reduce the water consumption per capita by 24% towards the end of 2020 and 43% towards the end of the next decade. The Qatrak Programme will reduce water stress throughout KSA by replacing the water supply equipment currently installed in infrastructures such as water sprinklers, water taps, shower heads, and the everyday facilities that are used that will be able to cut down water consumption and replace them with equipment that distribute a lower percentage of water.



How Quinoa is changing farmer's lives in Egypt's salt – affected areas

With the onset of climate change, the middle east and the Arab world is set to experience hotter summers, drier weather conditions and water scarcity, leading to uncertainty and unpredictability in the agricultural belts of the region. Egypt is one such country in this region that 11.2% of the nation's gross domestic product (GDP) depends on agriculture and cultivation, making it vital for the country's economy and prosperity to inculcate climate resilience into the agricultural sector. Soil salinity, is one of the primary causes in Egypt resulting in producing low yield and inhibiting plant growth. In 2010, the International Center for Bio-saline Agriculture (ICBA), took the initiative to guide and help the local farmers tackle the issue of soil salinity in a more effective way by introducing crops that were tolerant to high saline soil conditions. Quinoa was the crop that was advised by ICBA due to its ability to produce high yield in saline soil with low water requirements.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

World population day raises awareness on threatened species

World Population Day is an event that takes place on the 11th of July annually, established in 1989 by the then governing council of the United Nations Development Programme; it is a dedicated day to raise awareness on global population issues. As of now, it aims to continue to raise awareness while addressing the links between the environment and development. The Earth Day Network, an organisation for environmental movement based in Washington DC, has decided to focus this year's world population day on the one million species which are threatened by extinction, and ask everyone to join in to help spread this message. The global population is constantly increasing, roughly at a rate of 83 million people each year. A constant rise in population growth increases the demand for land and resources, which severely affects the fauna and flora worldwide. With such a rapid growth in our already over populated planet, this will result in an even larger growing demand for land and resources, with damaging effects to wild places. In order to accommodate the ever-increasing population, they resort to deforestation to gain more land for development. Which results in many animals suffering habitat loss and affecting the complex ecosystems and food chains that exist in nature resulting into animals not being able to survive in the remnants of their habitat and follow migratory patterns due to habitat loss. The increase in population growth results in an increase in the extraction of natural resources. However, these resources are not solely for humans, hence we are taking natural resources from other species that require them to survive.

EEG to attend the Regional Conservation Forum

The International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) will be hosting the IUCN World Conservation Congress on the 10th of June till the 19th of June 2020 in Marseille, France. The Congress is held every four years which brings leaders from government, civil society, indigenous peoples' organisations, businesses and academia to determine the world's most pressing environmental and development challenges, and actions to address them.


Leading up to the world's largest conservation event in 2020, the IUCN announced in the beginning of 2019 that it will hold eleven Regional Conservation Forums for IUCN members to prepare motions, which address any matter of importance related to the development and advancement of IUCN's mission and global conservation objectives. IUCN discusses these motions prior to the World Conservation Congress, since the most important and controversial motions will be on the agenda at the Member's Assembly for debate and final decision at the World Conservation Congress.

As one of the four members of the IUCN in the United Arab Emirates, EEG is proud to state that they will be attending the Regional Conservation Forum set to happen on the 9th of September till the 11th of September 2019 in Kuwait to support the IUCN in their goal of conserving the environment and harnessing the solutions nature offers to global challenges.

World Day to Combat Desertification 2019

The World Day to Combat Desertification (WDCD), a global initiative championed by the United Nations Convention for Combatting Desertification (UNCCD) was celebrated around the globe on the 17th of June, under the theme of "Let's grow the future together". The theme calls for the achievement of Land Degradation Neutrality through the involvement and cooperation of all levels of the global community

WDCD was established by the UN General Assembly 25 years ago to raise awareness on the global and national actions that address desertification, land degradation and drought. Joining the global celebration as it is customary every year, EEG has created an awareness poster on the importance of tackling land degradation and desertification, which was distributed through its social media channels and shared with its members, who were urged to support the UNCCD and share their stories in supporting the global strive for land degradation neutrality.



United Nations Environment Programme hosts the 2nd International Conference on Laudato Si'

The Laudato Si', On Care for Our Common Home, is an encyclical letter which was released by Pope Francis on the 25th of May 2015, which critiqued consumerism, irresponsible development, environmental degradation and global warming. The Vatican released the letter in nine different languages and was a call to all of the people of the world to take swift and unified global action. The Faith for Earth co-organised two important events on the 15th and 16th of July in Nairobi for the 2nd International Conference on Laudato Si' Generation marking the 4th anniversary of Laudato Si' and the 5th anniversary of Catholic Youth Network for Environmental Sustainability in Africa (CYNESA). It was hosted by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) with the Vatican delegation led by the Secretary of the Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development and the Faith for Earth Global Coalition. The theme set for this year was "Young People Caring for Our Common Home".

The events witnessed the attendance of more than 350 leaders from 50 different countries. Many working groups engaged in the discussions of interfaith collaborations, youth, indigenous people and Africa. This resulted into immediate actions from some of the youth participants which have already started the formation of the "Faith for Earth Youth Council".

Faith for Earth is an initiative which was started under the UNEP in 2008 and aims to achieve their goal to encourage, empower and engage with faith-based organisations as partners, at all levels, toward achieving the Sustainable Development Goals and fulfilling the 2030 Agenda.


