Dear Readers,

I wish you all a blessed New Hijri Year!

August brought with it many reasons for us to celebrate and enjoy with our friends and families but it was also an unfortunate time for the well-being of our environment. Many countries throughout the world experience the dreadful consequences of climate change. In Europe, an extreme heatwave has caused temperatures to rise in Spain, France, England and Russia has declared a **'state of emergency'** as a result of the wildfires in Siberia. Greenland shed more than **60 billion tons** of ice as a heat wave enveloped the Arctic island, triggering melting on a scale not seen since 2012. From July 31 to August 1, the ice sheet

lost enough weight to cover the state of Florida in nearly 5 inches of water. At the height of the melt event, rates of ice loss approached levels scientists had not expected to see until the late 21<sup>st</sup> century. And finally, as we all know, the lungs of our planet, the great Amazon Rainforest is on fire due to improper land management and the dissolution of the environmental protection agencies in the region.

Despite the tragic state of our environment, humankind is making positive steps to fight the effects of climate change worldwide. For the first time ever, scientists have been able to identify approximately how many trees will be needed to plant around the world to mitigate climate change impacts and the areas where they can be planted. The 2020 Tokyo Olympics committee has announced that the gold medals for the winners will be produced from gold extracted from electronic waste to send a strong message of circular economy. Kenya, who currently gets **70-75%** of electricity from renewables are aiming to go **100%** in the next year, which has resulted in a massive rise in investment and job opportunities in the sector, and are leading the way in sustainability in Kenya.

We at the Emirates Environmental Group believe it is more essential than ever to take proactive measures and spread awareness on the sustainable utilisation of Earth's limited resources and the advancement in technology. We have just concluded our fourth panel discussion on 26<sup>th</sup> August on the topic **'Artificial Intelligence and Sustainability'**. The event was received exceptionally well by all our participants and allowed for a very passionate and stimulating discussion on technology and its ability to impact positive change. The last quarter of the year is packed with programmes! EEG will host its popular educational programmes in the month of November. The students' Workshops are scheduled to be held from the 5<sup>th</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> November which are the most enjoyable educational experience for the students. There is also the Regional Inter College Environmental Public Speaking Competition being held on the 26<sup>th</sup> - 27<sup>th</sup> of November, which has been well received by many universities across the MENA region all set to take part in the competition. Finally, in December, we will be hosting the 18<sup>th</sup> cycle of the annual Clean Up Campaign from the 7<sup>th</sup> - 17<sup>th</sup> of December covering all the Emirates. The 19<sup>th</sup> of December is booked for the massive tree planting campaign that falls under the umbrella of our annual tree planting programme, **"For Our Emirates We Plant"**.

On the waste management front, our Neighborhood Recycling Programme has been ongoing since the 1<sup>st</sup> June and will end on the 30<sup>th</sup> of September. EEG has also launched the 2<sup>nd</sup> phase of its **'One Root One Communitree' (OROC)** project for corporate entities and individuals to take part in from 19<sup>th</sup> of August - 19<sup>th</sup> of November, entities are encouraged to collect certain quantities of recyclable materials (**plastic, paper, toners, mobile phones, glass and aluminum**) in order to be awarded a tree to plant in their name. In October, we will be conducting the Can Collection Drive across the UAE where we will visit each Emirate and ask the community to deposit as many Cans as possible to recycle (more details for the date on page 7).

EEG believes that the route to sustainable development starts with awareness and practical solutions. We continue to strive through our busy calendar for 2019 as we aspire to complete it with successful events and input & valuable lessons learnt.

## Phase 2 of OROC

EEG is rolling out the 2<sup>nd</sup> phase of its annual project “One Root, One Communi-Tree” (OROC) to mobilise the community and enable the growth of green urban space through tree planting of indigenous trees associated with this project. The Phase 2 of OROC was rolled out from 19<sup>th</sup> August 2019 and will run till 19<sup>th</sup> November 2019.

It will target corporations and individuals, wherein the participants may choose to collect and deposit the required targets of Paper, Plastic, Glass, Aluminium Cans, Toners and Mobile Phones for recycling within a period of two weeks. The last day to receive the registration to participate is the 30<sup>th</sup> of October 2019. The Phase 1 of OROC garnered great interest and participation from various entities. A total of **347,493 kg** of Paper, **21,492 kg** of Plastic, **334 pcs** of Mobile Phones, **1,238 Kg** of Aluminum Cans, **18,739 kg** of Glass and **952 pcs** of Toner Cartridges were collected from **253** participating entities.

Together, all the participants who achieved the target will be provided with an opportunity to plant **520 trees** under their names at the tree planting ceremony on 19.12.19. Similarly, those participants who are committed towards achieving the set targets within the time period for Phase 2 will also be eligible to plant a native Tree sapling under their name in one of the public areas of the UAE on 19.12.19. EEG looks forward to your active participation and registration!

## EEG organises its 4<sup>th</sup> Panel Discussion on Artificial Intelligence and Sustainability!

On 26<sup>th</sup> of August, the Emirates Environmental Group (EEG), in cooperation with the Arabia CSR Network (ACSRN), the Emirates Green Building Council (EGBC), Clean Energy Business Council (CEBC), and Swiss Business Council (SBC) organised its fourth panel discussion of 2019.

Hosted by Modul University, the discussion focused on “Artificial Intelligence and Sustainability”, a look into the opportunities and possibilities on how a smart and autonomous systems could aid in the fight against environmental damage and climate change. Over 50 attendees from different sectors of the industry and from different Emirates were present at the discussion which explored how artificial intelligence will aid in reducing costs, lowering emissions and improving efficiencies of our current practices.

The panel comprised of speakers who enlightened the attendees with their expertise, knowledge, research and best practices. The experts included Mr. Alexis Lecanuet, Regional Managing Director of Accenture, Mrs. Stefanie Schachtschabel, Founder and Managing Director of Globally Connected Companies, Mr. Firas Obeido, Chief Technology Officer at Smart Automation Energy, Mr. Vasudevan , Managing Directors at Navo, and Dr. Nikolaos Mavridis, Foudner and Director at Interactive Robots and Media Lab who attended the event virtually.



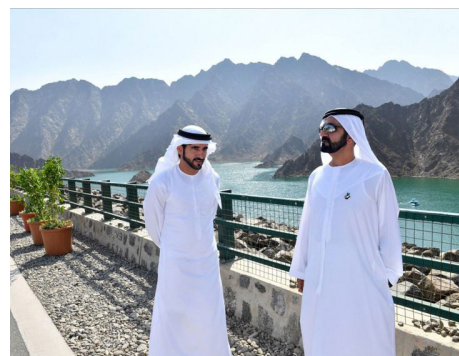
## CORPORATE NEWS

### Dubai awards contract for the region's first Hydroelectric power station

The Hatta hydroelectric power plant, a first of its kind in the region, is a strategic project that will diversify the energy mix, and support the economic, social and environmental development of Hatta. The 1.437-billion-dirham project will have a life span of up to 80 years and has a capacity to produce 250 MW. The project will also help the emirate achieve the goals of the Dubai Clean Energy 2050 – to provide 75 per cent of Dubai's total power output from clean energy by 2050.

The first hydroelectric power station in the GCC will feature a technology popularly known as the ‘pump-stored hydroelectric power plant’. The system will pump the water in the Hatta Dam using clean and cheap solar from the the Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum Solar Park to an upper reservoir. This ‘stored water’ will act as batteries, of the system. During periods of high electricity demand, the stored water is released through the turbines to generate electricity with an efficiency of up to 80%. Pumped storage facilities are able to economically sustain themselves by pumping during off-peak hours and releasing during peak hours.

“We are committed to supporting sustainable development, conserving natural resources and achieving economic, social and environmental development, in line with the aspirations of good leadership,” said H.E. Saeed Mohammed Al Tayer, MD & CEO of Dubai Electricity and Water Authority (DEWA).



### ENOC Launches Next Business Accelerator Program

ENOC Group initiated the Next Business Accelerator Program to explore development possibilities and track power industry problems by developing fresh digital initiatives for company and consumer industries.

## LOCAL NEWS

### First Phase of Aerial Drone Research Project Completed

The vast project stretching across nearly 6,000 farms aims to use Artificial Intelligence to better understand the complex ecosystem of the UAE and how to best preserve it. The research initiative by the ministry of climate change and the environment using aerial drones to facilitate the understanding of UAE's flora and fauna has now finished its first phase of exploration of vegetation and wildlife as well as water wells and farmland. The operation was spread across 550 sq km of agricultural lands across Dubai, Sharjah, Ajman, and Umm Al Quwain.

Phase two of the project will commence in October and will map agricultural areas in Fujairah and Ras Al Khaimah. Currently farming practices in the UAE can end up being extremely water intensive which is an undesirable situation as the region seeks to become increasingly sustainable. The project aims to estimate the amount of water used for irrigating the current landscape and reduce reliance on ground water by substituting it with more sustainable practices. Additionally, it accounts for influential factors such as soil type and crop diseases that are needed to make accurate statistical deductions.



### Launch of new initiative by RTA- Environmentally friendly Optare buses

The Road and Transport Authority (RTA) has launched 94 emission friendly buses in 17 new routes across Dubai. All the buses come equipped with features like free Wifi and USB ports on all seats. The buses also come equipped with wheel chair provisions and low floor entry doors for people of determination. The new design also means that the buses have increased space for passengers and are compatible with the European Emission Standards (Euro 5) meaning that it is light on weight and fuel consumption and doesn't have as harmful a carbon footprint as others.

The new initiative is among those aimed at reaching the RTA's masterplan to better Dubai's public transport system while keeping up with the highest international standards. The RTA also aims to put forward public transport as the ideal mode of commute and seeks to reach a rate of 26% for public transport journeys by 2030. Nine of the routes are new and aim to further integrate public transport systems.



### Sharjah aims to be the first zero-waste city by 2021

Bee'ah Sharjah's waste management company aims to make Sharjah the first zero-waste city in the region by 2021. Currently they have reached a waste diversion rate of 76 per cent. To help reach their goal they have initiated a number of programmes. The most recent one being in the Al Rahmaniya neighbourhood in Sharjah. Every household in this neighbourhood is given green and blue bins, in which general waste and recyclable materials will be stored, respectively. They hope that this programme will increase waste diversion from landfills. Additionally, they provide a "You Call We Haul" service, in which Sharjah residents can have their large waste collected. Moreover, Bee'ah also provides bulk bags that have the capacity of 1.5 tonnes as part of its Green and Bulky Waste Collection Programme. The materials collected from the blue bins and bulk bags will be recycled, recovered and regenerated in the Bee'ah Waste Management Centre. In the long run, Bee'ah strives to create a more sustainable future in which a circular economy is created.





### ***Dubai achieved 19% net reduction in Carbon Emissions***

Towards the end of 2018, Dubai had achieved a major milestone by reducing the emirate's carbon dioxide net emissions. By the year 2021, Dubai hopes to achieve a target reduction of 16% in Carbon dioxide emissions.

Dubai is continuously making the efforts of reducing their carbon emissions, in order to meet their target which is supported by Dubai Clean Energy Strategy, mentioning that they intend to be the first city with the least amount of carbon emissions produced by the year 2050.



### ***The 2019 Green Economy Summit highlights the sustainability accomplishments of Dubai.***

Under the patronage of HH Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, UAE Vice President, Prime Minister and Ruler of Dubai, the 6th World Green Economy Summit will take place on October 20-21 under the theme "Innovative Technologies for a Sustainable Economy." In the spirit of Dubai's green week, The 21st WETEX will take place holding their 4th Solar Energy Exhibition.

The Summit will concentrate on three primary topics: international green economy cooperation, the significance of international collaboration and alliances to meet worldwide difficulties and achieve the objectives of sustainable development, and the worldwide sustainability accomplishments of Dubai. "We are working towards sustainable development at all levels, including the UAE Vision 2021, the UAE Centennial 2071, the Dubai Plan 2021 and the Dubai Strategy, according to His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum's vision. By 2050, Dubai is going to be the world's least carbon city."

## REGIONAL NEWS

### ***Kingdom of Bahrain announces landmark plastic ban***

In June 2019, a ministerial order to regulate and phase out the use of plastic bags was announced across the Kingdom. The order also aims to ban the import of bags that are non-biodegradable, and future phases will include a permanent ban on the use of plastic bags at certain malls and supermarkets.

Furthermore, the government plans to expand recycling by increasing the total number of recycling bins, thereby reducing plastic waste that ends up in landfills, moving towards a full-fledged plastic ban. The country joined UNEP's global Clean Seas Programme in 2018 as part of efforts to mitigate the effects of marine pollution and protect the various species of once abundant but now threatened coral reefs, sea turtles, dugongs and numerous fish species.

While many big companies have already shifted away from harmful plastic bags, small corner shops as well as the food service industry continue to be regular users of the cheap and easy fix. Nonetheless, the youth of the country are a growing force in changing this as well as bringing their entrepreneurial skills to find other ways to take the country forward in terms of sustainability.



## INTERNATIONAL NEWS

### ***Iceland soon to become iceless!***

In 1978 a glacier called Okjokull located on the "Ok Volcano" in west central Iceland, was 3 square kilometers, now in 2019 that same glacier is less than 1 square kilometers. This significant glacier of Iceland was honored recently in passing as it certainly was the very first glacier Iceland has lost due to climate change.

Iceland has been losing 11 billion tons of ice per year, it is estimated that if climate change continues to go on, 400 glaciers in Iceland will lose their glacier status within 200 years. The Chief Executive of Skinney - Thinganes, one of Iceland's biggest fishing companies, has concerningly stated "The glacier is melting so much that the land is rising from the sea." Future predictions are being made with harsh statements, mentioning that as the temperature is rising across the arctic, which is said to be faster than any other place on earth, Iceland is to expect a future with no ice. Gudni Johannesson, Iceland's president has strictly said, "Climate change is no longer something to be joked about in Iceland or anywhere." Due the strong impacts of climate change, Ice land is budgeting \$55m on reforestation, carbon free transport and land conservation projects. However, Iceland is told to be prepared for the future, and if climate change continues to take place there will no longer be any glaciers left.



## IUCN NEWS

### ***Over 200 experts, specialists and senior Government officials declare a call for action to secure a future for Nature, People and Future generations in Africa***

Over 200 experts, specialists, senior government officials, community and youth representatives from 24 countries of Eastern and Southern Africa declared a call for action to secure a future for Nature, People and Future generations in Africa, at the ESARO Regional Conservation Forum (RCF) held in Johannesburg, South Africa from 23<sup>rd</sup> - 25<sup>th</sup> July 2019.

The theme of the event was 'Securing a future for Nature, People and Future generations' and the delegates who included Ministers responsible for environment from Uganda, Rwanda and Ethiopia spoke about their shared experiences and successes they had in terms of long term conservation interests in the region.

The International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) will be holding the IUCN World Conservation Congress 2020 in Marseille, France from 11 - 19 June 2020, which will be organised by the French Ministry for the Ecological and Inclusive Transition and IUCN. This is considered to be the world's largest and most inclusive environmental and biodiversity event. Over the past 70 years, IUCN Congresses have been influential in the establishment of global conservation treaties and initiatives. The themes for this event includes landscapes, freshwater, oceans, climate change, rights and governance, economic and financial systems, and knowledge, innovation and technology. Their aim is to attain global action to create a more sustainable future.

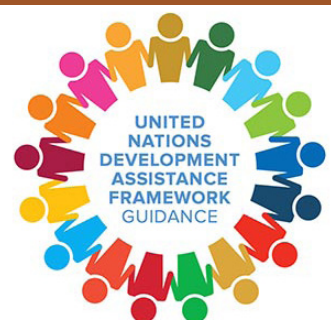

## UNCCD NEWS

### ***2019-2020 UNDAF signed in Santiago de Chile***

Representatives of the United Nations agencies, funds and programmes present in Chile gathered on 1<sup>st</sup> of August 2019 to sign the United Nations Development Assistance Framework (UNDAF) for the period 2019-2022.

The UNDAF outlines the assistance that will be provided to Chile by the UN and is part of the effort to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals as outlined in the 2030 Agenda which was a global commitment agreed to by over 193 states, including Chile. It identifies areas of joint cooperation on issues of institutional, social and economic development, gender equality and environmental sustainability.



## UNEP NEWS

### ***Ethiopia plants over 350 million trees in a day, setting new world record***

Marking a historical day for efforts to reverse the effects of climate change using geo-engineering, the National Tree Planting Campaign launched by the Gulele Botanical Garden in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia broke the record for the most ever trees planted in a day. Over 350 million trees were planted in an ambitious move to counter the effects of deforestation and climate change.

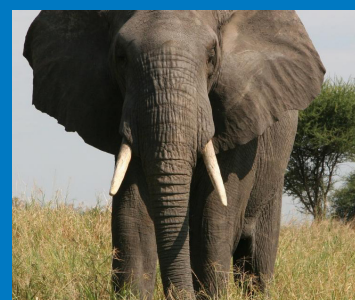
The event is part of Ethiopian Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed's Green Legacy Initiative. It aimed at planting 200 million trees in a single day in 1,000 sites across the country, beating the previous record held by India for planting 50 million trees.

### ***Kenya launches "Ivory Trade is a Rip Off" campaign***

Continuing efforts to quell illegal ivory trade and raise awareness, Kenya yesterday launched a new wildlife conservation campaign dubbed "Ivory Trade is a Rip Off".

The campaign calls for the listing of the African Elephant in Appendix I of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) - which includes species threatened with extinction - at the Convention's upcoming 18<sup>th</sup> Conference of the Parties (CoP18) following the dwindling numbers of elephants as a result of poaching.

It is supported by 31 other African states under the African Elephant Coalition. Kenya's Airport Authority was the first to join the United Buckingham Palace Declaration, which aims to involve the international supply chain that collaborates in the fight against wildlife trafficking.

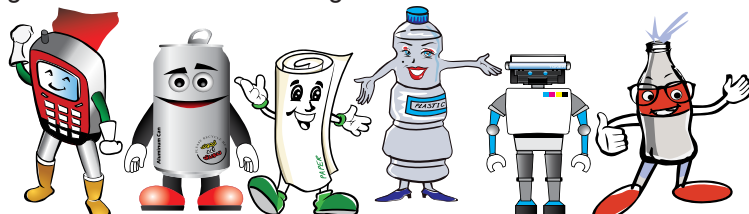
