5th May EEG in World Packaging Organisation

EEG has been selected as a full-fledged member of the World Packaging Organisation (WPO). The announcement and selection was made during WPO's Board meeting in Milan on 5th May. The World Packaging Organisation is a non-profit, non-government, international federation of national packaging institutes and associations, regional packaging federations and other interested parties including corporations and trade associations in the world.

Founded on September 6, 1968 in Tokyo by visionary leaders from the global packaging community, the purpose of the organisation includes encouraging the development of the packaging technology, science, access and engineering; contributing to the development of international trade; and stimulating education and training in packaging. EEG along with WPO are committed to educating people about the value that packaging adds to Society, not only for food but for beverages, pharmaceuticals, and virtually every product used by consumers and industry alike. EEG is also pleased to share that we are supporting UNIDO and LibanPack as they launched the **Arab StarPack Pro** in the Arab Region. It is the first industrial professional packaging competition for industries and professionals in the Arab World.

Arab StarPack Pro will recognise the best packaging design and innovations in consumer and industrial packaging in the Arab World bringing awareness about the important value that lies in well-designed packaging. Arab StarPack Pro is fully accredited and recognised by WPO (World Packaging Organisation) therefore the winners of Arab StarPack Pro will be eligible to apply for WordStar, the Global Packaging Award. 12th May Environmental Drawing Competition 2022

EEG's Environmental Drawing Competition 2022 witnessed the 2nd highest ever participation rate, it saw more than 144,680 students participate from 480 schools who took part in this cycle including schools with special needs.

The competition was based on three powerful themes, that were curated to encompass several UN SDGs. The topic "**Marine Life in the Arabian Gulf**" was developed for the students in the age bracket "6 to 8 years" which helped raise awareness and engagement of the youth to curb the use of unnecessary and unsustainable products, with emphasis on the precious oceans and marine life. As UNEP celebrated 50 years since its foundation and in 2021 UAE also celebrated 50 years since its establishment, EEG asked the students in the age group of "9 to 11 years" to look back and see how human way of life has affected the health of the ecosystem, the flora and fauna under the theme "**Nature - Looking Back 50 Years**". The oldest age group of "12 to 14 years" was told to show through creative art how their sustainable lifestyles can contribute to combat climate change in the topic "**Combating Climate Change - Your Contributions**".



To applaud the winners of this year's competition, EEG conducted a standalone awarding ceremony for the first time since the onset of the pandemic, on 12th May at the Ismaili Centre, Dubai. EEG Chairperson and Co-founder Mrs. Habiba in her opening address expressed her gratitude towards the commitment of the supporting entities; that included the Emirates Schools Establishment who played an active role in circulating the invitation and encouraging schools from all over the UAE to participate, the Ismaili Centre for providing the venue support. The winning students received gifts, courtesy of Unilever, Dabur, NFPC and the jury panel received vouchers from Four Point by Sheraton Sheikh Zayed Road and Four Points by Sheraton Downtown Dubai. In EEG's continuous effort to minimise the environmental impact of its activities, **3.5 metric tonnes** of CO₂ emissions produced as a result of this competition were offset, by making a sustainable contribution to voluntary climate protection, in collaboration with EEG's devoted corporate member, Farnek.

17th May EFQM hosted its 1st Middle East Summit

The European Foundation for Quality Management (EFQM) hosted its 1st Edition of "The EFQM Middle East Summit" in Dubai on 17th May which EEG attended. The theme for the summit was "Achieving a Sustainable Future for the Middle East Through Transformation". This 1st Edition of The EFQM Middle East Summit invited role model organisations where they took the attendees through their transformation journey and highlighted their experiences and best practices, using The EFQM Model. The Summit also presented thought-provoking presentations from inspirational speakers and industry experts on topics that challenge the audience such as Innovation, Sustainability, Circular Economy, and Transformation.

The Summit featured variety of expert Keynote Speakers and guests who included top leaders in the Public and Private Sector and Business Industry who shared their best experiences and strategies to help boost knowledge, productivity and learnings of the attendees. EFQM helps organisations perform better by creating data-driven insights backed up by organisational experts, to fit priorities, purpose and people. The EFQM Model is a globally recognised management framework that supports managing change and improving performance. Trusted by thousands of organisations worldwide for more than 30 years, The Model has provided a blueprint for organisations across and beyond Europe to develop a culture of improvement and innovation.

17th May National Dialogue on Climate Ambition (NDCA)

In December 2015, global leaders met in Paris for a climate deal. Negotiated under the aegis of the United Nations, it aims to hold the increase in the global average temperature to "well below" 2°C above pre-industrial levels. In 2020, the UAE submitted its second Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC) to the Paris Agreement, setting an economy-wide emissions reduction target for the first time. Building on this ambitious goal and recognising the opportunities that climate action holds for economic development and diversification, in 2021 the UAE Cabinet adopted a climate neutrality commitment. This decision puts the UAE on a path to net zero GHG emissions by 2050. The announcement of Net Zero Strategic Initiative 2050, a national drive to achieve net-zero emissions by 2050, was the first in the MENA region and



places the UAE as a climate leader. In order to meet this target, UAE needs to raise its ambition in key sectors. Through the National Dialogue on Climate Ambition (NDCA) organised by MOCCA, which EEG attended on 17th May, it aims to engage stakeholders in the priority sectors to define and raise UAE sectoral climate ambition, manage and enhance involvement in the Net Zero target, and assign a sectoral climate change champion. To raise national climate change ambition and ensure active stakeholder and sectoral participation in meeting climate targets, a monthly stakeholder assembly will be done from May till September 2022. The Dialogues will be led by UAE government departments and will look at several priority sectors including cement, energy, mobility, industries & manufacturing and waste. The NDCA will also act as a platform for discussions on how and when each sector can commit to reducing their carbon emissions, and the outcome of the NDCA will inform the UAE's Net Zero Strategy.

23rd - 25th May *Stockholm Forum on Peace and Development*

A crucial part of Stockholm International Peace Research Institute's (SIPRI) work on peace and development is the Stockholm Forum on Peace and Development. Held annually, the Stockholm Forum is a dialogue-driven event that provides a neutral platform for interdisciplinary exchange among members of international communities in the development, humanitarian, peacebuilding and security spheres. The 9th annual Stockholm Forum on Peace and Development was held under the theme 'From a Human Security Crisis Towards an Environment of Peace' from 23rd - 25th May and was co-hosted by SIPRI and the Swedish Ministry for Foreign Affairs.



EEG Co-Founder & Chairperson spoke under the session entitled "Research and Dialogue on Environmental Security in the Gulf" where she was joined with other Sustainability and water experts from the Arabian Gulf. The purpose of the Gulf regional dialogue on water security was to identify areas of common interest that can constitute a catalyst for greater cooperation between the countries in the region, including: the monarchies of the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC), Iran and Iraq.

This year's Forum also explored ways to enable an environment of peace in the face of converging crises. Against the backdrop of the Russian invasion of Ukraine and coinciding with the 50th anniversary of the United Nations Conference on the Human Environment, the Forum discussed long-term global challenges in the midst of the immediate security crisis. What needs to change within the economy, institutions, governments, organisations, companies and societies to sustain the natural environment, biodiversity and human progress while sustaining peace and security according to the goals set out in Agenda 2030? The 2022 Forum explored ways to address these converging crises. From grassroots and corporate action to global policy decisions, diverse stakeholders and participants will share solutions, good practices and lessons learned.

30th May *RIT Advisory Board Meeting*

EEG Chairperson attended the advisory board meeting of the Rochester Institute of Technology, Dubai, hosted virtually on 30th May. The meeting gave an overview of the University's Spring semester 2022. The discussions also revolved on the Smart Cities programme, Data Analytics programme and Future Foresight programme highlights.

The Board members further discussed on the University's on-going and upcoming researches and the update in its curriculum. As of now, RIT Dubai offers highly valued Bachelor's and Master's degrees in business and leadership, engineering, and computing.

The curriculum provides students with relevant work experience through an innovative cooperative education program that helps students stand out in today's highly competitive job market. EEG wishes the university the best of luck as it continues to make significant strides in its new campus.

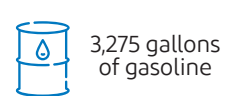

Tristar picks up majority stake in HGSI firm for \$215m

EEG's Corporate Member, Tristar Group, struck a deal with Madison Pacific to acquire a 51% stake in HG Storage International Ltd (HGSI). HGSI is a global portfolio of petroleum products storage and logistics businesses. Its terminals offer storage and distribution of various products. HGSI is a joint venture between Hong Kong-headquartered HNA Group and Glencore Group Funding Ltd.

Once the deal is finalised, Tristar will acquire a majority holding in a well-diversified portfolio of oil storage, distribution and retail assets owned by HGSI. The storage company comprises 8 operating assets across 4 regions: Europe, the Americas, the Middle East and Africa. The transaction, valued at \$215 million, will add in excess of 3 million cubic meters of fuel storage capacity to the Tristar portfolio and expand the company's global presence to 29 countries around the world.

Currently Tristar has fuel storage in the Pacific, Central America, North America, Africa and the Middle East.

Dubai Municipality Waste-to-Energy

Dubai Municipality recently announced that the construction of the Dubai Waste Management Centre (DWMC) in Warsan, the world's largest and most efficient energy project of its kind, is now 62% complete. The project will contribute to the Dubai Clean Energy Strategy 2050, launched by His Highness Sheikh Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai, the civic body said. The municipality added that more than 3.8 million working hours were spent to date by 30 companies tapped to carry out contracting, supply and consulting services.

By 2024, the facility will treat approximately 5,666 tonnes of solid waste across five burning lines daily, with 12,480 air filters to treat all emissions. The waste will be converted into energy, which will then be utilised to feed the local electricity grid with about 200 MW/h of clean energy. Mr. Dawood Al Hajri, director-general of Dubai Municipality, said that the strategic Dubai Waste Management Centre has focused on sustainable development, economic and environmental dimensions.

Unit 2 of Barakah Nuclear Energy Plant

The Emirates Nuclear Energy Corporation (ENEC) has announced recently the start of commercial operations of Unit 2 of the Barakah nuclear energy plant. This commencement of operations will add 1,400 megawatts (MW) of zero-carbon emission electricity to the national grid, bringing the total produced by Units 1 and 2 to 2,800MW. It also takes ENEC and its subsidiaries to the halfway mark of its commitment to supply up to a quarter of the country's electricity needs.

The Barakah Plant will produce up to 25% of the UAE's electricity needs when fully operational and will prevent over 22.4 million tons of carbon emissions annually, equivalent to the emissions of 4.8 million cars. By 2025, the plant will generate more than 85% of Abu Dhabi's clean electricity making it the biggest contributor to reducing the emirate's carbon emissions by 50% by the middle of the decade. The Barakah nuclear energy plant, which is located in the Al Dhafra region of Abu Dhabi, is one of the largest nuclear energy plants in the world, with four APR-1400 units. The development of the plant as a whole is now more than 96% complete.

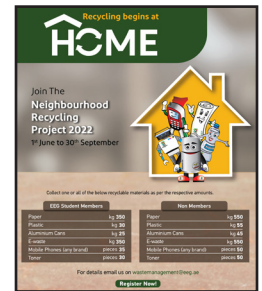

Neighbourhood Recycling Project

EEG has opened the door and is welcoming participants for the 12th cycle of the “Neighbourhood Recycling Project” (NRP) which was launched for the 1st time in 2010. The current cycle starts on 1st June and will conclude on 30th September. Since the inception, a total of 528,856 kg of paper, 19,817 kg of plastic, 4,033 kg of aluminium can, 6,437 pieces of mobile phones, 6,586 pieces of Toner, 160 kg of E-waste, 292 kg of beverage carton and 1,191 kg of batteries has been collected which mitigated 2,136 CO₂ emission in the atmosphere.

EEG’s goal behind this campaign is to create awareness at the student level on the need to protect & preserve the environment. It is vital to promote good ethical behaviour amongst families and enhance the creative potential of the youth and build on their communication skills. We have intentionally planned this platform to ensure that our youth will have the opportunity to engage and communicate with members of the society particularly their neighbours. Once the minimum targets are met, the proud achievers will take part in planting a tree under their name at EEG’s tree planting ceremony “For Our Emirates, We Plant” on 22.12.22.

Recycle.Reforest.Repeat

Each ton of recycled paper can save 17 trees, 380 gallons of oil, 3 cubic meters of landfill space, 4,000 kilowatts of energy, and 7,000 gallons of water. This represents a 64% energy savings and a 58% water savings! To contribute to energy and water conservation and the reduction of CO2 emissions, EEG conducts annually a paper collection campaign under the title “Recycle. Reforest. Repeat.”

This project aims to create awareness at the grass roots level on the need to preserve the environment by engaging various sections of the society during the summer months. World “at a crossroads”

UNCCD NEWS

Humanity is “at a crossroads” when it comes to managing drought and accelerating mitigation must be done “urgently, using every tool we can,” says a new report from the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD). Drought in Numbers, 2022, released this May 2022 to mark Drought Day at UNCCD’s 15th Conference of Parties calls for making a full global commitment to drought preparedness and resilience in all global regions a top priority. The report, an authoritative compendium of drought-related information and data, helps inform negotiations of one of several decisions by UNCCD’s 196 member states, that was issued at the conclusion of COP15. “We are at a crossroads,” said the director General of UNCCD. “We need to steer toward the solutions rather than continuing with destructive actions, believing that marginal change can heal systemic failure.” “One of the best, most comprehensive solutions is land restoration, which addresses many of the underlying factors of degraded water cycles and the loss of soil fertility. We must build and rebuild our landscapes better, mimicking nature wherever possible and creating functional ecological systems.” Beyond restoration, he adds, is the need for a paradigm shift from ‘reactive’ and ‘crisis-based’ approaches to ‘proactive’ and ‘risk-based’ drought management approaches involving coordination, communication and cooperation, driven by sufficient finance and political will.

Climate-Responsible Finance

UNEP NEWS

The United Nations Environment Programme, World Council of Churches (WCC), Muslim Council of Elders, and NY Board of Rabbis have signed a landmark joint appeal, “Climate-Responsible Finance - A moral imperative and responsibility to all children and the living world“. The findings of the latest IPCC report released on 4th April 2022 dramatised the critical urgency of this challenge. Therefore, the joint appeal calls upon financial service providers to take urgent and effective action to transition out of fossil fuel financing and to invest in renewable energies and research for climate solutions. The appeal calls upon financial service providers to require “oil and gas companies to stop all new development or expansion projects...including especially all such projects in the Arctic region,” and to join “the UN-convened Net Zero Asset Owner, Banking and/or Insurance Alliances, depending on the type of financial institution concerned, if they are not yet part of them.” The UN Secretary-General, Mr. António Guterres, welcomed the initiative. “For too long, the financial services sector has enabled the world’s fossil fuel addiction,” he added, “It is now time for financial service providers to accelerate the shift to renewables. They have the power - and the responsibility,”

World Economic Situation and Prospects

UN DESA

The World Economic Situation and Prospects as of mid-2022, released this May 2022, delved into the multitude of local, regional and global economic consequences of the current war in Ukraine. The war, which erupted in February 2022, has led to a severe global crisis on multiple fronts. In addition to the loss of life and massive destruction of civilian infrastructure, millions have been displaced. Energy, metals, food, and fertilizer prices have reached record levels, increasing the risk of food insecurity. New supply chain disruptions have hit the global trade system, and financial markets remained edgy amid interest rate hikes to counter inflationary pressures. As a result of the negative spillover effects of this ongoing crisis, global output growth is revised down significantly, while inflation is projected to rise further, relative to the earlier forecasts released by UN DESA in January 2022. The war is also expected to exacerbate existing vulnerabilities and inequalities in developing and least developed countries already weakened by the COVID-19 pandemic. At the same time, the war could pose significant new challenges for global climate action amid soaring energy costs and energy security concerns.

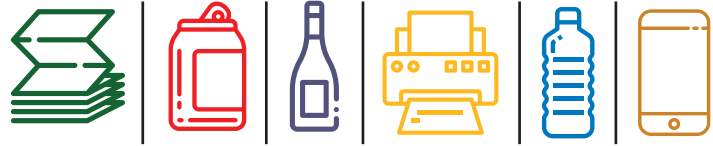
