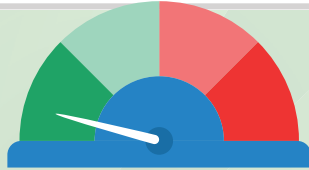

## Habiba Al Mar'ashi

Dear Readers,

The concept of sustainable waste management in the 21<sup>st</sup> century is as much about resource management and recovery, as it is about safe and effective disposal.

Research shows that on July 28, humans will have consumed more natural resources in 2022 than the ability of the Earth to regenerate this year. They estimate that humans used natural resources 1.7 times faster than ecosystems can regenerate - or, put another way, consumed resources that 1.7 Earths can produce. Over the last decades, the date has been creeping up the calendar every year, in 2020 the date moved back three weeks due to the COVID-19 pandemic, before returning to pre-pandemic levels.

Experts widely agree that rising demand to meet the needs of billions of people has transformed land use and generated record high levels of pollution, affecting biodiversity, forests, wetlands, water bodies, soils and air quality. The world population is projected to reach 9.7 billion in 2050 and 11.2 billion by 2100. Unsustainable production and consumption patterns and trends and inequality, when combined with increases in the use of resources that are driven by population growth, put the health of the planet at risk to attain sustainable development. Those unsustainable trends are leading to deterioration in planetary health at unprecedented rates.

The world urgently needs to undertake a systemic reform of resource use. We need to see a near-total shift to renewable sources of energy, which have the power to transform lives and economies while safeguarding the planet. Now more than ever, exceptional and urgent action is required by all nations with strengthened international cooperation to reverse negative trends and restore planetary and human health.

Since the inception of EEG, it has been working tirelessly and effectively to engage in meaningful ways to protect and the preserve the environment.

The month of August was no different; and I'm pleased to share here that EEG has already successfully achieved the year 2022 target of collecting 7,000 kg of E-Waste in 8 months. I am confident that with your support and active participation we shall achieve the targets of all our projects this year.

On 22<sup>nd</sup> August, the best technologies and policies for sustainable development in the packaging industry was discussed by EEG at the 4<sup>th</sup> Panel Discussion titled "Taking Packaging, Full Circle" along with industry experts and changemakers. Read more on page 3.

## 22<sup>nd</sup> August 4<sup>th</sup> Panel Discussion

The Emirates Environmental Group (EEG) held the fourth panel discussion of 2022 on the topic of “Taking Packaging, Full Circle” in a hybrid format on 22nd August. The session was conducted in association with ACSRN and supported by EGBC, CEBC and the Swiss Business Council. **Al Bayader International** and **McDonald’s UAE** were the **main sponsors** of this event while **Jotun** and **Taghleef Industries** were the **co-sponsors**. Majid Al Futtaim hosted the session at Sheraton Hotel - Mall of the Emirates.

The expert panelists included Ms. Nerida Kelton (Vice President - Sustainability & Save Food - World Packaging Organisation), Ms. Samah Mohamed Al Hajeri (Director of Co-operatives & Strategic Reserve Department, Ministry of Economy UAE), Mr. Jamil Haddad (Head of sustainability and Business Development - Al Bayader International), Mr. Abdul Rasheed (Regional Sales Manager - Taghleef Industries), and Mr. Santosh Kumar, Manager (Quality Control and R&D - Falcon Pack). They represented their entities and shared their expertise and knowledge on the subject matter. Ms. Nerida gave deep international insights stating that “8 billion kg of plastic waste flows into the oceans every year.

This emphasises the need to produce packaging that is circular in nature. By designing circularity in waste packaging, keeping products and materials in use, and regenerating natural systems we can reinvent everything. Some solutions to advance circularity in this industry are: Labeling the packaging products with honesty, can prove effective to guide the consumer to put them in the right bin. Return to store packaging products is very important and an efficient solution to reduce packaging pollution. WPO has designed a best practice tool available freely on their website which is an internationally designed harmonised method. Waste stream mapping tools and guides are available freely on their website to guide the industry and develop circularity in the packaging industry.”

Ms. Samah Mohamed Al Hajeri spoke from the government’s standpoint as follows “UAE Circular Policy was launched to encompass 4 priority sectors including food. The Circular Policy Committee manages the workings and evaluates the gaps in achieving the objectives of the UAE Circular Policy. The committee is a two way communication system that takes recommendations from different sectors forward to the cabinet to prepare policies and strategies to achieve the goals holistically.”

From a corporate perspective, Mr. Jamil Haddad shared “Circularity is more than just recycling, reusability, remanufacturing and regenerate. Bayader focuses on designing products for reusability and regenerating the environment. A lot of packaging products are plant based which has advantages. Another key factor it to regenerate biogas. Carbon footprint can be reduced by 75% by using plant based solutions. 62% waste ends up in the landfills in the UAE; therefore Al Bayader is taking the lead to develop circularity in locally designed packaging in the UAE.”

Mr. Abdul Rasheed emphasised that “Sustainable packaging is the most efficient source and flexible solution to consumers. With our commitment towards a more sustainable future and a circular economy, we offer a new service approach called reDESIGN. It is a tailor-fit service solution for our customers to lead the switch from a traditional packaging structure to a more sustainable and innovative solution that best meets customers’ specific packaging requirements.”

Mr. Santosh Kumar brought to the discussion the following viewpoint “1/3<sup>rd</sup> of the food is wasted all over the world every single year. If not wasted it is sufficient to feed two billion people. He stressed “Packaging is not the problem, packaging is the solution if simple design changes are made to packaging design, and it can save 650,000 tons of food waste and additionally save 120 billion gallons of water per year. Some of the solutions that are implemented by them are reducing supply chains carbon footprint, Optimising sustainability in design focusing on end of life, using material sourced responsibly, product offerings to enable sustainable consumer choices. Falcon has pledged to do business from Eco and Biodegradable/compostable items by 2025.”

The meaningful panel discussed the leadership role of the UAE is talks on the implementation of technologies and innovation in the packaging industry. The presentations were followed by a lively interactive session where the experts and audience shared information, discussed queries, pondered on the challenges, opportunities in hand and uncovered the truths and complexities of the future of the planet.

In EEG’s continuous effort to minimise the environmental impact of its activities, 2.50 MTCO<sub>2</sub>e produced as a result of this event were offset, by making a sustainable contribution to voluntary climate protection, in collaboration with EEG’s devoted corporate member, Farnek.

## 29<sup>th</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> NDCA

August

The Ministry of Climate Change and Environment (MOCCA) launched the National Dialogue for Climate Ambition (NDCA) on 17<sup>th</sup> of May as a platform that will be running from May to September 2022, to define and raise sectoral climate ambition and advance all-inclusive participation in the UAE Net Zero by 2050 Strategic Initiative to meet the country's international climate commitments, particularly the Paris Agreement.

NDCA has engaged stakeholders in UAE priority sectors, including manufacturing, cement, waste, transport, and energy, through hosting a monthly stakeholder assembly dedicated to a different sector every month to explore sectoral requirements, priorities, and future direction to scale up their contributions to reducing carbon emissions. In this context, EEG Co-Founder & Chairperson, Mrs. Habiba Al Mar'ashi attended the 4<sup>th</sup> NDCA



session under the theme “Roadmap to achieve net zero in hospitality sector” on 29<sup>th</sup> August. It witnessed the launch of the UAE Climate Change Action Alliance to shed light on the private sector companies and establishments’ sustainable practices to achieve carbon neutral operation.

During the session, a draft pledge to achieve NET ZERO was finalised and endorsed by more than 20 companies operating in the fields of Energy, Aluminium & Steel, Financial, Hospitality & Real Estate, Healthcare and Medicine, Construction and Manufacturing. The pledge covers greenhouse gas emissions, sustainable business transformation, best practices, environmental offsets and mentorship.

### Neighborhood Recycling Project (NRP)

EEG believes that the well-being of our planet actually lies in the hands of our children, who have the power to make a significant difference to their future. Believing in their critical role, EEG is currently running the 12<sup>th</sup> cycle of the “Neighborhood Recycling Project” (NRP), a student focused waste management programme that started on 1<sup>st</sup> June and will run until the 30<sup>th</sup> September 2022. Under the project, students are required to collect plastic, paper, aluminium cans, e-waste, mobile phones and toners. So far, 69 students have participated and 43 students achieved their targets, resulting in the collection of:



If targets are achieved within a period of two weeks, participants are provided with a certificate and a sapling of an indigenous tree to plant under their names to acknowledge their efforts. You still have one full month, don’t miss the opportunity and register to participate.

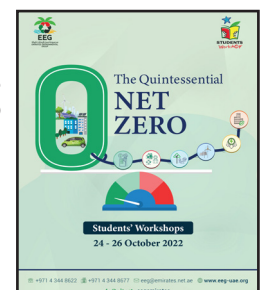

### Confronting the Growing Drought Risk

UNCCD in a recent report establishes that owing to climate change and land degradation, droughts are becoming more frequent, more severe, and more widespread. Building national and regional risk-management systems that can endure what is coming will require political will and significantly more international cooperation. Drought may be an ancient scourge, but it is getting worse. No region or country today is immune to its effects. Southern Europe is in the grip of a severe drought - the worst in 70 years for Italy. In the western United States, the past two decades have been the driest in 1,200 years. Chile is in its 13<sup>th</sup> consecutive year of drought, and Monterrey, Mexico's third-largest city, is now being forced to ration water. The Horn of Africa, Ethiopia, Kenya, and Somalia are recording their fourth consecutive year without rains, and the situation has grown increasingly dire for people, livestock, and the ecosystems that support them. Together, recent traumatic experiences and the latest scientific projections should convey a sense of urgency, compelling everyone to build resilience against future drought risks. Drought is a natural phenomenon; but it needs not become a natural disaster. Land degradation can be mediated at least partly with better land-and water-use decisions and land-restoration initiatives.

### Launch of the High Ambition Coalition to End Plastic Pollution

Plastic pollution constitutes a planetary crisis with impacts on ecosystems, biodiversity, the climate and human health. Without new and effective control measures, plastic production is set to double in 20 years and plastic waste leaking into the oceans is projected to triple by 2040. This is an unacceptable burden to place on future generations. In this context, a High Ambition Coalition to End Plastic Pollution was launched on 23rd August. It is Co-Chaired by the Minister of Environment of the Republic of Rwanda, and the Minister of Climate and Environment of Norway. It is a group of like-minded countries that have taken the initiative to form a following the adoption of resolution 5/14 "End Plastic Pollution: Towards an International Legally Binding Instrument" by the UN Environment Assembly in March 2022. The High Ambition Coalition to End Plastic Pollution is committed to develop an ambitious international legally binding instrument based on a comprehensive and circular approach that ensures urgent action and effective interventions along the full lifecycle of plastics. The common ambition is to end plastic pollution by 2040. At the outset of the plastic treaty negotiations, they have outlined three strategic goals and seven key deliverables for success in this regard.

### ESG Book Adopts GISSD Sector-Specific Metrics

ESG Book has incorporated recommendations made by the GISSD Alliance for sector-specific, SDG-related metrics in its digital platform, facilitating the adoption of these metrics by the 25,000+ companies covered by the platform. The ESG Book aims to create ESG data as a public good by making the data freely available to all stakeholders. It connects investors and companies and enables companies to provide sustainability data directly to their stakeholders. Companies using ESG Book can already report on different sustainability reporting frameworks, which are mainly sector-agnostic or not directly linked to the SDGs. With the inclusion of GISSD's metrics, they can now digitally report on their performance against key sector-specific metrics of SDG performance. Investors and other stakeholders can use the resulting data to align their investment strategies and decisions with the SDGs. GISSD's metrics come in two different sets: five 'core metrics' that are considered minimum disclosure and more 'expanded metrics' that cover additional impact themes and supplementary metrics.
