EEG Co-Founder and Chairperson, Mrs. Habiba Al Mar'ashi was amongst a few selected from a line of leading Emiratis who were celebrated at the official 51st UAE National Day Celebrations held on 2nd December. December**WorldGBC Board Meeting**

In her capacity as WorldGBC Board Member, EEG Co-Founder and Chairperson, Mrs. Habiba Al Mar'ashi attended virtually the World Green Building Council's (WorldGBC) Board meeting on 7th December. While reflecting on the highlights of 2022, the WorldGBC members discussed the parameters to catalyse the development of built environments that were put forth at 43 events at COP27 in collaboration with the #BuildingToCOP coalition.

As the most influential local-regional-global action network leading the sustainable transformation of the built environments, the WorldGBC celebrated the 20-year anniversary with 200+ attendees at the WorldGBC+20 Leadership Summit which has now opened new doors for stronger collaborations through CEO networking. Following the agenda, they streamlined the global strategy for 2025 - 35 to deliver systematic meaningful change at scale and achieve "Sustainable & decarbonised built environments for everyone, everywhere".

14th
December**Countdown to the UN SDG Summit 2023**

EEG as an accredited UNEP member attended virtually on 14th December, the 2nd in a series of 8 SDGs' monthly webinars, 'Countdown to the UN SDG Summit 2023'. This webinar concentrated on SDG 3—ensuring healthy lives, SDG 4—ensuring inclusive and equitable quality education as well as the tradeoffs and synergies with other objectives. It looked at several strategies for enabling integrated approaches to SDG implementation with an emphasis on mechanisms that unite a variety of stakeholders to hasten the achievement of the goals. The executive director of Stakeholder Forum, hosted the webinar and the assistant professor at Trinity Business School, Trinity College Dublin, and advisor on SDG partnerships & governance for Stakeholder Forum, moderated the discussion with several SDG and sustainability experts.

The webinar's goals included motivating the acceleration of SDG implementation as well as encouraging the creation of communities of practice that would continue to work together in the run-up to the SDG Summit and beyond. As well as to pinpoint strategies for maximising beneficial interactions and minimising trade-offs, such as through building coalitions of various stakeholders around initiatives for expedited action. To identify good practices for empowering communities, sectoral actors, and cross-sectoral alliances at multiple levels.

The experts discussed different ways to enable integrated approaches to the implementation of SDG 3 & SDG 4 with a special focus on mechanisms that bring together a range of stakeholders to accelerate progress toward the goals. They spoke about a sociopolitical parity and a psychological equilibrium for a balance, where one needs to look at all as equal. It was emphasized that humans need to adopt sustainable solutions and recognise that we are responsible for future generations. The overall goal of the series is to encourage the formation of communities of practice that will keep working together up until and after the SDG Summit.

December**Tristar's Sustainability Workshop**

EEG Co-Founder and Chairperson, Mrs. Habiba Al Mar'ashi, attended the 7th edition of the Tristar's 2022 Sustainability External Stakeholders Workshop on 14th December at their headquarters in Jebel Ali. The informative consultation with stakeholders, expedited dialogues on Tristar's global commitments to sustainability.

The workshop also briefed on the planning of environmental, social, and governmental strategies (ESG) based on the analysis of the materiality assessment conducted by stakeholders, which is due to be incorporated in Tristar's 2022 sustainability report in line with the Global Reporting Initiative (GRI) standards.

EEG attends the Global Launch of Feminine Monitoring for Sustainable Development Award

EEG virtually attended on 22nd December, the launch of the global award “Feminine Monitoring for Sustainable Development” at the second cycle of the Environment Protection and Development Authority held in under the patronage of H.H Sheikha Amna Bint Saud Al Qasimi, May Allah Protect Her.

The award bagged the gold position at the British Ideas Foundation for the year 2018 as it proved itself to be a world-leading idea and initiative in the field of environmental action that empowers women from different backgrounds (housewives, employees, educational leaders and teachers, students...etc.) to excel in the field of environmental work, encourage them to put forth best sustainable practices, develop innovative ideas and provide solutions to the ongoing challenges faced in sustaining our environment. The award is presented to women who have provided measurable results in spreading awareness at root level and implementing sustainable practices throughout residential and commercial units.

Clean Up UAE returned for its 21st cycle as ‘Clean UAE’

The most awaited national environmental action programme conducted in the UAE has concluded its 21st cycle. Having successfully instilled sustainable habits amongst the people of UAE for the past 20 years, our campaign, earlier known as ‘Clean Up UAE’ was rightfully rebranded as ‘Clean UAE’, effective 2021. Executing this large-scale campaign, we witnessed vast stretches of clean land; a reflection of collected commitment to protecting our environment and clean habitats of local wildlife to thrive.

Held under the patronage of Ministry of Climate Change and Environment for the 3rd consecutive year and welcoming the Ministry of Community Development in this cycle, we extend our gratitude towards the two ministries for extending their support to “Clean UAE”. The 21st cycle engaged 61,646 participants including various officials including H.E Mariam Al Mheiri, Minister of Climate Change and Environment and H.E Hessa Bu Humaid, Minister of Community Development, who contributed to the total collection of 40,404 Kg across the seven Emirates and covered a total area of 38.5 km², from December 5th to 15th, in the collective efforts to keep UAE clean.

The volunteers went above and beyond in searching for waste at the designated sites and returned with a mix of vehicle tyres, rugs, disposables and broken glass amongst others. In cooperation with the municipalities and other relevant bodies in each Emirate, the collected waste was then segregated and sent for proper disposal while the recyclables were collected by EEG team and sent to local recycling facilities. ‘Clean UAE’ has positioned itself as a pioneer in uniting federal bodies, local government entities, private sector companies, the academia and the public at large to maintain cleanliness at our tourist and hidden spots in line with the World’s Coolest Winter Campaign and efforts directed towards fulfilling COP28 agenda. This incredible feat is credited to the supporting government entities and corporate partners who showed relentless commitment throughout. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to the Municipality and Planning Department of Ajman, Fujairah National Resources Corporation, Sharjah City for Humanitarian Services, Sharjah Municipality, Dubai Municipality, Management of Saif Al Salam Protected Area, RAK Public Service Department, and the Abu Dhabi City Municipality represented by the Municipalities of both the Shahama and the Musaffah cities.

For Our Emirates We Plant

With deforestation practices contributing directly to climate change, our unique urban afforestation campaign 'For Our Emirates We Plant,' that links with our waste management practices, acts as an effective countermeasure against desertification. With the intention to support the nation's goals to increase sustainable green spaces in the UAE, EEG conducted its annual tree-planting campaign "For Our Emirates We Plant" on 17.12.22, in association with Environment and Protected Areas Authority (EPAA) and One Hive, at Al Minaie (Skheibar Area) - South of Ras Al Khaimah in a beautiful Bee Reserve. This event was held under the patronage and presence of H.E. Engineer Sheikh Salem bin Sultan bin Saqr Al Qasimi, member of the Executive Council of the Government of Ras Al-Khaimah, Chairman of the Department of Civil Aviation and Honorary Member of EEG.

Bringing the whole community under the one common roof, the event engaged with more than 1,200 participants including 182 companies, 62 academic institutions and 209 families who collectively planted native Samar tree saplings under their respective names, as a gesture of appreciation for their commitment to exceeding the set targets within EEG's recycling programmes conducted throughout the year.

Taking a different route at contributing to a healthier and sustainable environment, 33 corporates also joined the "For Our Emirates We Plant" under the "Adopt a Tree" project. This acts as an effective means for corporates to conduct their CSR along with their team members. EEG in partnership with Aster Healthcare planted 500 Sidr tree saplings on 11th December at the same Reserve. EEG planted a total of 3,023 Samar tree saplings in Ras Al Khaimah on 17th which brings the total since the inception of this programme in 2007 to 2,114,318 trees planted. Throughout the year 2022, EEG has planted 9,069 indigenous trees. These trees upon maturity in 3-5 years will support the sequestering of 53.48 MT CO₂ emissions annually. We extend our gratitude towards Aster Healthcare, Coca Cola, Almarai, Al Ain waters, Tetra Pak and Delmonte for supporting us in collectively making this campaign a resounding success.



Green December 2022

EEG concluded the final campaign of the year 2022 on 22nd December, with our beloved EEG student members. The Green December project registered the participation of 47 students backed by relentless support from the parents. We commend them for the sheer determination and hard work that they have put into giving this campaign a new light. Green December, which is exclusive to student members was rolled out in 2014 with the goal of increasing environmental literacy and introducing recycling patterns amongst the youth. Going above and beyond, our students collected

1,200 students from Al Warqa'a take part in the 21st cycle of 'Clean UAE'

As the journey through the 7 Emirates was ongoing from 5th December to 15th December, the students of Our Own High School, Al Warqa'a opened a new site and conducted the 'Clean UAE' campaign with EEG on 7th December. A total of 1,200 students and many supporting teachers along with three EEG staff conducted the campaign outside the campus grounds. Dubai Municipality extended its support by providing the skips and labourers, where the students collected 1,570 kg of waste from a stretch of 3.5 km² land. We laud the commendable steps taken by the students to protect the surrounding of the school premises, the ecosystem around the area and conserve the natural resources.

Can Collection Campaign 2023

Back with a Bang! The 27th cycle of the Can Collection Campaign will kick off in the first week of January. Incepted in 1997, the Can Collection Campaign was the 1st community action programme launched by EEG to support the Leadership's vision of becoming a more sustainable economy. EEG has till the end of 2022 collected 378,083 kg of used Aluminium cans for recycling since 1997, which led to the mitigation of 5,675 MT CO₂e, saved 86,046 Million BTU of energy and 9,178 m³ of landfill space. The collections reflect the positive direction our society has shifted towards, becoming aware of their social responsibility. In 2022, we witnessed tremendous participation wherein we amounted a total of 25,474 kg of Aluminium cans, exceeding our target of 20,000 kg.

Hoping to break records once again, we call on all our participants to actively take part in our upcoming 'Can Collection Day' scheduled to be held on 26th February 2023. The action-packed day engages participants from all over UAE who come together under the common goal to reduce carbon emissions and promote a circular way of living.

One Root, One Communi-tree Phase 1

Since its inception in 2010, our crowd favourite programme, the “One Root One Communi-tree” (OROC) has branched out into countless homes and institutions within the UAE; instilling the values of sustainability and promoting recycling as a way of life. Rolled out in two phases, this action-packed programme is conducted from January to May (phase 1) and July to November (phase 2) annually.

The 12th cycle of OROC in 2022, witnessed the highest collections of recyclables since its inception, with 344 participating entities in phase 1 and 317 participating entities in phase 2. The entities that achieved the target goals set under this project planted 3,023 saplings of the native tree - the Samar tree in Al Minaie in Ras al Khaimah on 17.12.22! At EEG, we are certain that 2023 will bring with it heavy tidings and that the 13th cycle of this unique urban afforestation project will attract even more entities and emerge with the higher collections. Planting trees is one of the best ways to stabilise the climate. By increasing natural carbon sinks, we are purifying the air we breathe. Parallel to that, it also ensures a sustainable habitat for the local bees and reversing the effects of climate change. A great deal can be achieved simply by monitoring the consumption and recycling patterns. Scheduled from Jan 23rd - May 23rd, phase 1 of OROC will accept the collections of Paper, Plastic, Glass, Aluminium Cans, E-waste, Toner cartridges and Mobile phones.

We look forward to everyone's active participation in the coming cycle and commitment in eliminating the Triple Planetary Crisis with EEG.

UNEP Releases State of Finance Nature 2022 Report

In the month of December, UNEP released the second edition of the State of Finance Nature 2022 report which measures and defines the available funding for nature-based solutions, quantifies actions that protect and restore eco-systems, combat biodiversity loss and mitigate climate change as financing towards sustainable commitment remains unbalanced. According to the report, currently US\$154 billion is directed to funding nature solutions, when US\$384 billion is needed per year by 2050 to eliminate the adverse effects of the Triple Planetary Crisis.
