Dear members, sustainability enthusiasts and valued readers,

As we approach the final stretch of this transformative year, December stands out as a beacon of significance, aptly designated 'The Year of Sustainability.' This month marks the commencement of COP28, ushering in a period of intensified global collaboration and discourse on environmental priorities, policies, and cutting-edge technologies. The closing chapter of 2023 promises dynamic unity among nations, global entities, private sectors, start-ups, NGOs, and communities in a collective effort.

Since our inception in 1991, the Emirates Environmental Group (EEG) has been a pioneer in fostering collaboration across sectors. Even before environmental discussions were mainstream, we championed the mission of uniting every stakeholder for planet protection, aligning with the spirit of SDG#17 and emphasising the power of partnerships. As sustainability enthusiasts, we eagerly awaited the day when crucial conversations about environmental protection would take centre stage. With COP28 on the horizon, ensuring its effectiveness is imperative, especially as it marks the first comprehensive stock take against the Paris Agreement. This evaluation will guide productive discussions and instil a sense of urgency, propelling us towards decisive climate action.

At EEG, our commitment extends beyond the boundaries of our annual initiatives. Navigating the intricate landscape of November, a month pulsating with energy and anticipation, our focus intensifies. It's not merely about executing signature events; it's a dedicated journey on the "road to COP28," actively carving out our space on the global sustainability stage. November witnessed our participation in 29 sustainability events across 30 days. Amidst this bustling month, the ambient melody of the EEG office underwent a transformative shift. A vibrant symphony, resonating with the rhythm of incessant phone calls, typing cadences, purposeful steps, online discussions, meticulous preparations, and the ever-present murmur of recyclable materials finding their way to our recycling hub in and around the EEG office. This orchestration of activity is not just a routine; it's a symphony of purpose, passion, and preparation as we gear up for a prominent presence at COP28.

We started the month with EEG's  $27^{\text{th}}$  Can Collection Drive, held on November 5, and achieved remarkable success, collecting 26,831 kg of aluminium cans, reaching 97.6% of the 2023 goal of 27,500 kg. Since 1997, a total of 404,917 kg of aluminium cans has been collected, mitigating 6,077.8 MTCO<sub>2</sub>e and saving 9,829 m³ of landfill space. The community's commitment, including government entities, corporations, academia, and families, contributed to this outstanding result. Key supporters included Dubai Municipality, Dubai Department of Economy & Tourism, with special thanks to Support Sponsor Sharlu Lubricants and logistical support from various entities. The partnership with Lucky Recycling underscored collaboration as a key driver in achieving sustainability goals.

In my capacity, in addition to the cluster of speaking engagements and attending events all over the UAE, I was also interviewed by various forms of media, as I dedicated my efforts to circulating knowledge

among the masses. On 10<sup>th</sup> November, I was interviewed by Al Dhafrah TV, where I shared the key outline of UAE's Net Zero 2050 goals. On 18<sup>th</sup> November, in an interview with Sharjah TV at the Bee'ah HQ, I reflected on the transformative shift towards sustainability. On November 29<sup>th</sup>, I attend another interview with Dubai Eye 103.8, where I discussed in detail EEG's contribution to COP28 and the upcoming Clean UAE campaign. On 30<sup>th</sup> November, I was interviewed by Al Mashhad Channel to discuss the profound impact of climate change and the biological connection between nature and humans.

EEG conducts various activities to disseminate information and engage audiences of all types. EEG prioritises youth engagement in the climate change fight with a recent highlight being the 23<sup>rd</sup> Inter College Environmental Public Speaking Competition. The Emirates Environmental Group (EEG) successfully conducted this edition from 20<sup>th</sup>-23<sup>rd</sup> November, featuring 526 participants from 24 countries. Aligned with COP28, the event addressed global environmental issues under four themes. The event, with over 5,900 attendees, was live-streamed on YouTube. The competition showcased international collaboration and insightful discussions on critical sustainability challenges.

Overall, this month has been packed without realising the limitations of the hours in a day. We were actively engaged with UNEP during November to discuss pressing issues such as plastic pollution, food security and nature positive solutions to reinforce our commitment to global environment decision-making. More information can be found in the UNEP News section of this newsletter. EEG also conducted two volunteer meetings for the upcoming Clean UAE campaign in December, one of the biggest community events in the country and supported by the UAE Cabinet as a national event, as we mobilise the community in all seven Emirates for a cleaner and safer future.

As our beautiful winters kick in, EEG is actively gearing up for a series of invigorating outdoor programmes. EEG's 'For Our Emirates We Plant' initiative thrived, November also saw us planting 4,300 trees in Abu Dhabi and Ras Al Khaimah. Partnerships and collaborations with organisations like Al Shahama Municipality, MVP Tech, Abu Dhabi Terminals, Ma'an Social Incubator, and Aster DM Healthcare engaged over 950 volunteers. Mr. Abdul Aziz Al Midfa'a and I, EEG's Vice Chair, led this urban afforestation effort contributing to sustainability goals, mitigating 25.36 MT  $\rm CO_2e$ . Since 2007, EEG has planted 2,120,712 trees, fostering environmental engagement and awareness for a greener future.

Reflecting on the past 11 months, witnessing the nation's inclusivity at COP, let's conclude this year on a high note. Together, we can inspire lasting change and address the challenges of climate change. I am concluding this note by inviting each and every one of you, as we step into the final month of 2023, to unite in making it a successful "Year of Sustainability" and incorporate our learnings and findings from this year, into every year. Join EEG in these efforts for a better tomorrow through environmentally conscious actions.

# EEG's 27<sup>th</sup> Can Collection Drive Triumph: A Community Mobilisation Success Story in the UAE

EEG proudly announces the remarkable success of its 27th Can Collection Drive, held on November 5. With an impressive collection of 11,254 kg of Aluminium Cans from across the 7 emirates of the UAE. The drive exemplifies the power of collective efforts in realising sustainability goals.

Initiated with the ambitious target of collecting 27,500 kg for 2023, the drive garnered widespread support from various sectors, reaching a total collection of 26,831 kg, achieving 97.6% of the set goal till date. # EEG Attended the Committee of Permanent Representatives Subcommittee Meeting

EEG attended the Committee of Permanent Representatives Subcommittee Meeting, held on November 7 which saw significant discussions on environmental issues. The Nitrogen Working Group presented a draft Voluntary Action Plan, emphasising its role in supporting member states with their commitments under the Global Biodiversity Framework. Another key topic was the implementation of UNEA resolution 5/12 on Minerals and Metals Management, with delegates highlighting the importance of safety and sustainability measures in mining practices. Preparations for the upcoming 10<sup>th</sup> annual subcommittee meeting were also discussed, with a call for an agenda item on the future perspectives of environmental multilateralism. The meeting concluded with an invitation to the Nairobi Dialogue series on combating marine litter and plastic pollution.

# 9th - 26th EEG Plants 4,300 trees under 'For Our Emirates We Plant' Campaign in the Month of November

With this year announced as the year of sustainability, in efforts towards a sustainable future, four organisations partnered with EEG in the afforestation programmes. This year witnessed a new record by accounting the highest collections in Phase 1 with 414 participating entities and phase 2 with 439 participating entities.

### At Least 100 Million Hectares of Healthy Land Now Lost Each YearUnveiling the Global Challenge of Sand and Dust Storms

Two billion tons of sand and dust, equivalent to the weight of 350 Great Pyramids of Giza, infiltrate the atmosphere annually, with over 25% attributed to human activities, warns the UN Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD). These storms, becoming more frequent worldwide, wreak havoc from Northern and Central Asia to sub-Saharan Africa, impacting health, agriculture, industry, transportation, and air quality. While sand and dust storms are a natural phenomenon, their severity intensifies due to poor land and water management, droughts, and climate change. The UNCCD stressed that human actions can both exacerbate and mitigate these storms. The UNCCD, FAO, and partners offer a Sand and Dust Storms Compendium and Toolbox, providing guidance on data collection, monitoring, early warning, impact mitigation, and source mapping.

During a meeting in Uzbekistan, UNCCD experts launched reports addressing sand and dust storm impacts on agriculture, offering guidance for mitigation, adaptation, policy, and risk management measures. The meeting, convening in Central Asia for the first time, comes amid rising concerns about global land degradation, with the world losing nearly 1 million square kilometres of productive land annually. Recognising sand and dust storms as a cross-sectoral hazard affecting 11 of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals, the UNCCD advocates for a comprehensive, multi-stakeholder approach involving land restoration, early warning systems, and impact mitigation strategies. As we confront the challenges of these storms, global cooperation and informed policies are essential to protecting our environment and foster sustainable development.

In another UNEP event held on 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> November, EEG gained valuable insights from international consultations supporting Major Groups and Stakeholders in preparation for the 6th UN Environment Assembly (UNEA 6). Actively contributing to the dialogue, EEG reinforced its dedication to global environmental decision-making on topics ranging from pollution to nature-positive solutions.
