Held this year between the 16th & 17th of April, EEG was delighted to be part of this global event which attracts thousands of participating entities.

EEG was thrilled to receive a booth to set up and interact with all the attendees. The summit was extremely effective, despite heavy rains that halted several areas. EEG team battled the challenges and was present to ensure sustainable progress will not be halted. EEG is always thrilled to be part of events that drive sustainability on all levels.



24th Green Call Project Concludes

April

The 'Green Call' is one of EEG's annual recycling projects that brings together different sectors of the society for the betterment of the environment. Amongst the major issues faced worldwide is the increase of electronic waste. As more and more people across the globe go digital, the number of smart phone users will continue to increase. With the life span of a smartphone ranging between 2-6 years, it becomes an important role of the country to minimise the waste accumulation of mobiles and rather opt for recycling and resource recovery operations.

This project uniquely aims to collect mobile phones and send it to proper facilities for recycling. This year, a total of **25 families, 5 corporations and 5 Academic institutions** participated in the project, collectively depositing **874 mobile phones** for recycling. As part of the incentive, those entities that reached the target goals are now eligible to receive a certificate of appreciation and a tree sapling to be planted under their name on **24.12.24**. The mobile phones sent for recycling will effectively help mitigate **0.1 MT CO2e**, prevent **718 trees** from being cut and save **3,048 gallons** of gasoline.

25th Bloomberg Business Summit

April

EEG chairperson as one of the most prominent environmental personalities in the region, was invited to be a speaker at the Bloomberg Sustainable Business Summit in London. She joined a panel alongside other eminent personalities in the session "**In Focus: ESG in Emerging Markets**"

held on **25th April 2024**.

Mrs. Al Mar'ashi highlighted the UAE's strides in advancing Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) principles within emerging markets. She talked about the strategy and commitment to renewable energy, with plans to meet 50% of UAE's energy needs through renewables by 2050.

Furthermore, she emphasised the UAE's holistic approach to CSR, which goes beyond metrics to focus on community engagement, cultural preservation, and social development. Initiatives like the Masdar City project exemplifies this commitment, blending tradition with innovation for sustainable urban development. Through practical implementation and strategic partnerships, the UAE is driving scalable and sustainable solutions, setting regional standards for sustainable development and inspiring collaboration towards a resilient future.

The goal of the summit was to address the changing ESG scenarios and that one size does not fit all, she emphasised on the need to take regional diversities into perspectives and discuss various climate ambitious goals while maintaining business values and leaders remaining flexible to change for better.

The 1st State of the Environment Report for the State of Kuwait

In cooperation with the United Nations Environment Programme—West Asia office, the Environment Public Authority of Kuwait has launched the 1st “State of the Environment Report” for the State of Kuwait. The report was launched at a ceremony held in the capital, Kuwait, under the patronage of HE Mrs. Samira Mohammed Al-Kandari, Acting Director General of the Environment Public Authority.

The report was written with the help of national and regional experts who contributed to its preparation. This report aims to analyse the driving forces behind climate change and the pressures that accelerate it. Consequently, the report also aims to shed light on the current gaps in policies in relation to environmental management, which will act as the basis for future environmental policies and strategies.

The report focused on 7 main issues: climate change, waste management, land resources, water resources, the atmosphere, biodiversity, and the coastal and marine environment. Furthermore, the report explores the sustainability paths that the State of Kuwait can undertake while presenting important recommendations.

The Integrated Environment Assessment method used by the United Nations Environment Programme was relied on to prepare reports on the status and outlook of the environment at the local, national, regional and global levels.

Business4Land: Mobilising private sector to reverse land degradation

Transforming our production and consumption patterns has enormous potential to reverse land degradation and biodiversity loss, as well as mitigate climate change. The economic benefits of land restoration are huge: half of the world’s GDP is dependent on nature, and every dollar invested in restoration generates up to USD 30 in benefits.

Despite its importance to economic activity, Sustainable Development Goal 15 Life on Land is one of the least financed SDGs. The private sector can play a critical role in achieving the goal to restore 1.5 billion hectares of degraded land by 2030. It can facilitate investments and technology for sustainable production as catalysts for a transition to sustainable land use and promote the expansion of value chains for sustainable consumption for healthy lands and people.

UNCCD made its mark at the Change Now Conference held from **25th to 27th March** at the Grand Palais Ephémère in Paris by bringing together innovators and investors from the private sector to find solutions that have the power to reverse and halt current land degradation trends.

The Business4Land strategy, presented by UNCCD during the World Economic Forum 2024 in Davos, seeks to mobilise the power of the private sector to advance Land Degradation Neutrality by enabling transition from our current extractive and extensive land-use models towards sustainable land management.

At the Paris meeting, UNCCD launched discussions on innovative financing models, highlighting the role of private sector investments in land restoration projects and productivity enhancement business models. Highlighting the potential for carbon sequestration and natural-based solutions, the Convention showcased the economic viability of sustainable land-based projects to encourage entrepreneurs to seize untapped opportunities.

The Business4Land initiative unites private sector leaders to improve business practices, contribute to sustainable financing tools, explore leveraging mobile new technologies and best practices to support further land restoration investments. Companies are invited to join the Business4Land initiative and define voluntary actions and announce them at UNCCD COP16 in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia in December 2024.
