

#### Habiba Al Mar'ashi

Greetings to all our members, readers and well-wishers,

Recent studies revealed that a 1°C increase in global temperature will lead to a 12% decline in the world gross domestic product. The world has already warmed by more than 1°C (1.8°F) since pre-industrial times and many climate scientists further predict a 3°C (5.4°F) rise will occur by the end of this century due to the ongoing burning of fossil fuels. As a result of the unstable geo-political conditions across the globe, our planet has already experienced unprecedented heatwaves that we witnessed gripping parts of South Asia and Europe. Several cities are experiencing their hottest days ever recorded. Simultaneously, devastating wildfires ravaged parts of the western United States and Canada causing widespread destruction of forests, homes, and infrastructure.

Our planet is facing an array of climate threats that are intensifying and demanding immediate attention. Failure to act decisively will only exacerbate these threats, putting our planet and future generations at even greater risk. EEG in its unwavering commitment to curb climate change, engaged in a several activities and discussions that paved the way for sustainable progress and pushed the planet towards safer climate and economic conditions.

Beginning the month strong, EEG in association with the Ministry of Education shed light on the importance of proper waste disposal methods through a waste management and segregation workshop engaging 174 students on 2<sup>nd</sup> May and another one on 8th May. EEG & MOE tailored the waste management programme to be implemented on school grounds which allowed students to see 1st hand effective waste reduction and environmental conservation. As a vital component to creating sustainable and liveable cities, EEG in partnership with Abu Dhabi City Municipality, represented by the Shahama Municipality Center, planted 3,000 saplings of local trees on 11<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> May, which were supported by the Authority of Social Contribution - Ma'an, under the common goal of engaging societies to collectively, battle climate change.

I am pleased to share that we have organised our very popular and well-known educational programme, the 24th cycle of the 4 day long 'Inter School Environment Public Speaking Programme' (ISEPSC) programme from 13th to 16th May, with marvellous contributions from the students between the age group of 13-18 years old. We also concluded phase one of our community favourite action programme - the 'One Root, One Communi-Tree'. Upholding my commitment towards environmental advocacy, I attended, in my capacity as advisory board member, the 1st RIT advisory board meeting of 2024 on campus grounds, on 21st May.

We organised and put forth a wonderful awarding ceremony for the notable educational programme, 'Environmental Drawing Competition' on 22nd May by announcing and awarding the winners of the competition. This year, the winning students also took part in a new competition that we conducted in partnership with Warner Brothers Discovery – Cartoon Network MENA where they competed under different topics with the challenge of incorporating one or more of the sustainability cartoon character role model in their art. On 23nd May, as Founder of a leading environmental NGO committed to driving sustainable growth, I joined a panel at the launch event of the Dubai Chamber Stockbrokers and Investment Servic-

es Business Group and contributed to a critical dialogue about shaping the future of our global economic landscapes, under the theme 'Future of Investments: Emerging Trends and Strategic Focus '.

May, also saw EEG participate in a couple of regional and international events, such as UNEP & WPO networking events and more. Mobilising the society and attending such important webinars enables us to grow our knowledge of best practices that are pertinent to the growth and development of the organisation. Further along my schedule, I virtually attended the WGBC Governance and Nominations Committee on 23rd May. I am also delighted to say that EEG took an active role in participating in the 28th meeting of the SFS Programme's Multi-Stakeholder Advisory Committee from 23rd to 24th May in France to discuss various issues with the other committee members.

On **26<sup>th</sup> May**, I was invited to witness an exclusive launch of "**Optimum Green Ventures**" that is supporting the establishment of climate tech companies setting base in the UAE, at the Dinner held at the Rosewood Hotel in Maryah Island, Abu Dhabi. As a full-fledged voting member of the World Packaging Organisation, EEG is often invited to attend webinars and take part in critical meetings. As part of their series of meetings on measures taken by European Packaging and Packaging Waste Regulations, EEG attended the 2<sup>nd</sup> session of the webinar held on **27<sup>th</sup> May**.

On **29**<sup>th</sup> **May**, EEG was also attended an online webinar organised by the Global Partnership on Plastic Pollution and Marine Litter (GPML) discussing an important topic: Sea-based Sources of Plastic Pollution and Marine Litter. The discussion that brought in key industry experts was truly educational.

Wrapping up the eventful month, EEG held its 3<sup>rd</sup> panel discussion on **30<sup>th</sup> May**, under the theme, "**Economic & Social Instability: Hindering Sustainable Progress!**", at the Five Palm Hotel, Dubai. The discussion was crucial in unravelling the ongoing links between climate deterioration and geopolitical instability across borders.

Amid the flurry of events and changes, one thing remains clear: our commitment to fostering sustainable change is unwavering. As we navigate the shifting tides of weather and our socio-economic environment, our collective efforts to minimise the damage becomes increasingly crucial. It is essential that we seize every opportunity to mitigate climate threats and build resilience within our communities.

For the month of June, keep a look out for our new programme, 'Purging Pestering Plastics', the 'Recycle.Reforest.Repeat.' 'the 'Neighbourhood Recycling Project', and our next big event of the year, the 'Emirates Recycling Awards'. We urge you to not miss out on these green opportunities.

As we move half way into the year, let us reaffirm our commitment to environmental stewardship by embracing green habits that benefit our planet and future generations. Every small change—collectively contribute to a significant impact. # 11th, 18th & 25th EEG Forges Ahead with its Urban Afforestation Programme

May

With concerted efforts to accelerate green zones within the UAE, EEG carried out multiple afforestation drives under the umbrella of our flagship programme "For Our Emirates We Plant". In partnership with Abu Dhabi City

Municipality, represented by the Shahama Municipality Center, EEG planted a total of 3,000 indigenous trees in the capital on the 11th, 18th and 25th May. The trees planted were supported by the Authority of Social Contribution – Ma'an, under the common goal of engaging members of the society to collectively battle climate change.

Since the inception of the "For Our Emirates We Plant" programme in 2007, EEG has successfully planted 2,130,600 indigenous trees in the region, making a significant impact on reducing carbon emissions. These trees mitigate annually approximately ------ MT of CO<sub>2</sub> emissions from the atmosphere. We extend our gratitude to our supporting entities Almarai, Nestle, Golden Loaf – Golden Spike and our healthcare partner Ahalia Medical Group for aiding in the green transition of the nation









#### One Root, One Communi-tree Phase 1

May

We are delighted to share that we concluded the phase 1 of the 'One Root, One Communi-tree' programme on 24.05.24 which witnessed a strong participation and hard work from 340 entities across all sectors of the society in the UAE.

From the 7 recyclable material categories, a total of 272,476 kg of Paper - 39,367 kg of Plastic - 52,546 kg of Glass bottles - 2,131 kg of Aluminium Cans - 143 pcs of Mobile Phones - 1,690 pcs of Toners - 1,602 kg of E-Waste were collected for recycling from various individuals, students, families, corporations, academic institutions, hotels and government entities.

The contribution transpired in the reduction of 1,168 MT CO<sub>2</sub>, saving of 9,015 Million BTU of Energy, saving of 2,718 m<sup>3</sup> of Landfill Space, saving of 4,749 Trees from being cut and saving of 1,075 Gallons of Gasoline. To recognise such a remarkable contribution, EEG will honour those who have achieved the targets by planting with them a total 673 trees by the entities who have met their target so far on 24.12.24.

We thank our committed members and participants who have helped us to achieve our goals and brought us a step closer in our path to a circular economy. We look forward to welcoming you once again for the launch of phase 2 of OROC on 24.7.24. Stay tuned to know more.



## 30th EEG's 3rd Panel Discussion for 2024

A key arena for disseminating knowledge, bringing together experts, and keeping everyone May in the loop is a well-planned panel discussion. EEG started these discussions as community lectures back in 1992, which have evolved today to strong panel discussions that bring together attendees from all sectors of the society, from high school students to CEOs and ministerial delegates to international embassy representatives. EEG's critical panel discussions enables the participants to be well grounded in the sustainability loop and also to network and ask key questions during the sessions.

EEG's 3rd Panel Discussion was held under the theme "Economic & Social Instability: Hindering Sustainable Progress!". It was held at the Five Hotel, Palm Jumeirah. The Arabia CSR Network was the CSR partner at the discussion and the discussion was held in association with Emirates Green Building Council, the Clean Energy Business Council and the Swiss Business Council. The discussion brought together 4 expert speakers who shared their valuable insights on the topic of the importance of a stable economy and society to steer sustainable development in a positive manner.

Ms. Hanan Khalifa Al Thuwaini from the Ministry of Economy brought in the much-needed perspective from the public sector and government on what actions the UAE is taking to ensure stability in the country. Mr. Layth Al Dwairi, co-founder and COO of Tathmeer Agro Tech, shared his expertise on agriculture in the region and how it impacts the 3 discussion spheres. Ms. Dina Storey, CEO of Optimum Green Ventures, brought a global perspective on the matter and her expertise to the stage and finally Dr. Salam Sharif who spoke about the importance of solid legal frameworks to govern the socio-economic growth to ensure that it does not hinder sustainable development efforts.





The interactive session fostered meaningful discussions, aligning with EEG's commitment to UN Sustainable Development Goals and accelerating climate action in the country and beyond. Along with the critical questions asked by the head of the session (Chairperson of EEG), the audience asked questions from their outlook on the matter. Overall, the discussion was well received by all in attendance.



#### **Waste Management and Segregation Workshop**

Emirates Environmental Group in collaboration with the Ministry of Education organised the Waste Management and Segregation Workshop on 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2024. The Workshop aimed at educating students on the importance of proper waste management practices and promoted behavioural change towards responsible waste disposal in schools.

By raising awareness about environmental impacts and teaching practical skills like waste segregation, the workshop succeeded in empowering the students to take ownership of waste management in their communities. The challenges were addressed during the workshop and students were encouraged to engage in community programmes and shown how to measure impacts. The workshop sought to foster a culture of sustainability and inspire action toward reducing waste generation and promoting recycling for a cleaner, healthier and better environment.

The workshop gathered more than 174 participants from students enrolled in Leadership and Diplomacy programmes with the Ministry of Education.

#### Workshop on Developing Waste Management & Educational Programmes in Schools

Emirates Environmental Group collaborated again with the Ministry of Education to conduct a workshop for 80 participating teachers and administrators from different schools; government and private across UAE on how to develop proper Waste Management and Educational Programmes in Schools through a workshop on 8th May.

The Waste Management and Educational Programme Workshop in schools aimed to raise environmental awareness encourage responsible behaviour, empower students, and foster collaboration for sustainable waste management. Through comprehensive educational, hands-on learning activities, and skill development sessions, they gained knowledge about waste management principles and recycling to reflect on their consumption habits. By fostering community partnerships and providing ongoing support, the workshop aimed to inspire students and teachers to take proactive roles in promoting waste reduction and environmental conservation both within their schools and in their broader communities.

### The 24th Cycle of Inter Schools Environmental Public Speaking Competition

The Emirates Environmental Group (EEG) held the 24<sup>th</sup> cycle of one of its most popular annual Educational Programme known as the "Inter-School Environmental Public Speaking Competition" at Dubai Gems Modern Academy School. This prestigious platform is rolled out every year for School students to voice their perspectives on vital sustainability issues in alignment with the UAE's continuous year of sustainability.

The 612 participants were encouraged to present problems and put across corresponding effective solutions crucial for the preservation of natural resources and the continuity of life on our planet. This unparalleled national competition offers a platform for students within specific age brackets to channel their environmental enthusiasm and convey it through artistic expression.

The professional artists serving as jurors in the UAE arrived at the EEG office on the morning of **April 14**th, kicking off the judging process with enthusiasm. Inside the conference room, a vibrant display of artwork adorned the tables, showcasing pieces from both mainstream schools and centers catering to students with special needs.

#### **Upcoming Event**

#### **Neighborhood Recycling Project**

Summers with EEG translates to only one thing - our exciting student summer programme, the 'Neighborhood Recycling Project'. Conducted annually, EEG is rolling out the 14<sup>th</sup> cycle of its widely popular programme; NRP; from 1<sup>st</sup> June till 30<sup>th</sup> September. This initiative primarily focuses on raising environmental awareness amongst students and encourages the preservation of natural resources. The programme pushes students to collaborate with neighbours to recycle in the spirit of combatting climate change while enhancing their interpersonal skills in the path of becoming mindful future leaders.

Since 2010, the participating students have collected **576,973 kg** of paper - **24,530 kg** of plastic - **4,409 kg** of aluminum cans - **875 kg** of glass - **6,925** mobile phones - **8,088 pieces** of toner cartridges and **916 kg** of e-waste. These efforts have reduced **2,232 MTCO**<sub>2</sub> emissions, saved **15,384 million BTUs** of energy, preserved **2,974 m**<sup>3</sup> of landfill space, conserved **26,909 gallons** of gasoline, and saved **15,498 trees**.



We anticipate remarkable contributions from our dedicated students this year as well, aiming for both increased results and a positive environmental impact. We urge student members to register for this summer project and lead their communities toward sustainability. Participants who meet the minimum targets will be rewarded with a native tree sapling to be planted under their name at EEG's year end tree planting campaign, "For Our Emirates, We Plant," on 24.12.24. #### **UN Environment Assembly advances collaborative action on Triple Planetary Crisis**

The sixth UN Environment Assembly (UNEA-6) concluded on March 1st, in Nairobi, Kenya, with Member States adopting 15 resolutions to address the triple planetary crisis of climate change, biodiversity loss, and pollution. Over 5,600 participants from 190 countries attended the week-long event at the UN Environment Programme (UNEP) headquarters.

The resolutions focus on managing metals, mineral resources, chemicals, and waste; providing environmental assistance in conflict-affected areas; implementing integrated water resource management; promoting sustainable lifestyles; and rehabilitating degraded lands and waters.
