Dear members, partners, valued readers and well wishers

The current sustainability landscape is witnessing unprecedented change, driven by climate urgency, technological breakthroughs and evolving societal expectations. Governments, businesses and communities are recognising that sustainability is no longer a peripheral consideration—It is central to resilience, competitiveness and long-term growth.

Today, the nexus of environmental stewardship, social responsibility and economic innovation defines the future of successful organisations and national strategies alike.

At the Emirates Environmental Group (EEG), September 2025 has been a month marked by progress, recognition and active engagement across a spectrum of sustainability initiatives. It is a period that reflects our ongoing dedication to environmental protection and social responsibility and also our role as a connector, advocate and thought leader in shaping the UAE's sustainability agenda.

We began the month with a significant milestone: the addition of EEG's 4th recycling truck, expanding our fleet and dramatically increasing our operational capacity.

This addition reflects our commitment to enhancing the efficiency of our recycling programs, enabling us to collect and process a higher volume of recyclable materials across communities from all the Emirates. This expansion is made possible thanks to our committed supporters, partners and volunteers, whose collaboration strengthens our ability to transform local environmental action into measurable impact.

On 1st September, EEG entered a strategic partnership with Hebron University through the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding, establishing a framework for collaboration on environmental education, knowledge exchange and research partnerships.

This initiative underscores EEG's belief in empowering the next generation of sustainability leaders and fostering a regional dialogue on environmental stewardship. That same day, we joined and contributed to the 12th Annual Subcommittee Meeting of the Committee of Permanent Representatives (CPR) to UNEP, reinforcing our role in global environmental governance and international policy engagement.

On 3rd September, I spoke at the Dubai Municipality Sustainability Forum 2025, engaging with key stakeholders and contributing to discussions under the theme "Sustainability Pioneer of the UAE", reflecting our commitment to promoting innovative and impactful environmental solutions across the country.

Following this, on 9th September, EEG participated in the launch of the Water Programme of the Year by the MENA Alliance for Green Schools, supporting initiatives that encourage sustainable practices in education and community development. Thought leadership remained a core focus throughout September. EEG played a pivotal role at the 6th Global Vertical Farming Conference on 10th September, acting as both a keynote speaker and a supporting partner, highlighting sustainable urban agricultural solutions that address food security and environmental efficiency.

On 11th September, we participated in the World Green Building Week Roundtable, discussing the implications of the new Federal Climate Change Law for the built environment. This was followed by my role as a speaker at the DWTC Sustainability Dialogues, 2nd Edition, where the session, under the theme "Reporting, Reduction & the Role of Offsets", explored practical strategies for emissions reduction, the responsible application of carbon offsets and the integration of ESG principles in event management.

The discussions highlighted actionable steps organisations can take to achieve measurable sustainability impact. On a personal note, I was honoured and recognised on 17th September as one of the UAP's Most influential Sustainability Leaders by Khaleej Times, a recognition reflecting the meaningful impact of EEG's ongoing initiatives in environmental stewardship, corporate social responsibility and sustainable development.

EEG's engagement in international governance and youth-focused initiatives continued with participation in the 171st Committee of Permanent Representatives Meeting, the Youth Forum on Climate Protection 2.0, and the CPR Subcommittee Meeting on 16th & 18th September. We also attended a briefing on the 2nd World Social Summit, exploring how public-private partnerships can advance sustainable development through effective investment strategies and collaborative solutions.

On 25th September, I contributed to the Preparatory Workshop on Climate Adaptation Financing by MOCCAE, as well as the ADSW 2026 programme unveiling session, shaping the UAE's sustainability agenda for the year ahead.

This month exemplifies EEG's holistic approach to sustainability: from operational enhancements like our expanded recycling fleet to global advocacy, cross-sector partnerships, youth engagement and thought leadership. Each initiative reinforces our philosophy that meaningful change arises from collaborative action, innovation and accountability. We continue to demonstrate that sustainability is not merely a goal but a guiding principle embedded in every decision, partnership and programmes that we undertake.

Looking ahead, I am delighted to share and call on your support as EEG is once again the Environmental Partner for the 'Global Sustainability & CSR Forum' organised by our sister organisation; the Arabia CSR Network which is scheduled to take place on 8th – 9th October 2025 at Dubai University. Organised under the patronage of the Ministry of Economy & Tourism and in strategic partnership with Dubai Chambers, this Forum is set to convene international thought leaders, policy makers, business leaders and practitioners to discuss, share and advance global sustainability agendas.

As we reflect back on September, we remain committed to inspiring measurable environmental and social impact, driving systemic change and empowering communities, institutions and governments to embrace sustainability as a core strategy.

Together with our partners, stakeholders and supporters, EEG continues to champion innovation, collaboration and action to build a resilient, inclusive and sustainable future for the UAE and beyond.

Together, they highlighted how collaborative, school-based interventions can drive meaningful water conservation practices while fostering sustainability literacy. The session concluded with a strong call on the necessity of conserving water as a shared responsibility, emphasizing the need for collective action to achieve this vital goal.

Can Collection Drive 2025

Emirates Environmental Group proudly continues its flagship recycling initiative, the Can Collection Drive, into its 2025 cycle. Since its inception in 1997, this campaign has grown into a nationwide movement, uniting academic institutions, corporations, families, and especially the hospitality sector in the shared mission of environmental stewardship. Over the years, the campaign has successfully diverted 461,615 kg of aluminium cans from landfills. This effort has mitigated 6,929 metric tonnes of CO₂ emissions, saved 105,057 million BTU of energy, and preserved 11,206 m³ of landfill space—clear evidence of the enormous environmental benefits that can be achieved through collective action.

For 2025, EEG has set an ambitious target of collecting **35,000 kg of aluminium** cans to be recycled. Thanks to the dedication of our participants, we have already achieved **62.3% of this goal**, but more support is needed to cross the finish line. The Can Collection Drive which is taking place on 8th November is a solid community engaging platform, fostering a culture of responsibility and advancing the UAE's
